He states the Peace Establishment as reported by the
Committee 1786 to be £15,478,000.
By the Committee 1791. 15,971,000.

That the Average produce of the Taxes for the Years
1791-2-3, was £14,240,000.
To which add Land and Malt 2,558,000.
£16,798,000.

That the same Taxes produced on an Average of
3 Years ending 5. January 1796 £13,961,333.
