In the preceding Year there was only One Half Year's Artificers Bills paid. These Circumstances sully explain the apparent Increase in the last Year. In the present Year the Expenses must be considerably augmented by the Necessity of doubling the Mileage to the Mail Coach Contrastors, and of increasing (pro tempore) the Allowances for Riding Work to the Postmasters, in Consequence of the unexampled high Price of Horse Provender.

IT being represented to His Majesty, by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, that the Comptrollers of Army Accounts, as Two of the Commissioners for auditing the Public Accounts, had the same Trust reposed in them, together with the same Attendance and Labour in every Respect, as the other Three Commissioners for auditing the Public Accounts, whilst they enjoyed One Moiety only of the Salary granted to the Three other Commissioners; at the same Time that the Duties of their Office of Comptrollers of Army Accounts was increased to a great Extent in consequence of the present War: His Majesty, by his Warrant dated 22d of August 1798, was graciously pleased to grant to the Two Comptrollers of Army Accounts an additional Allowance at the Rate of £.500 2 Year each, from Lady Day 1797 to Midsummer 1798; and by another Warrant dated the 11th April 1799, was graciously pleased to direct that the said additional Allowance of £.500 a Year each, should be continued to be paid to the faid Comptrollers fo long as the Pressure of their Business in consequence of the War should continue, and from and after that Period an additional Allowance of £.250 a Year only to each of them.

The Annual Expenses of the Office (borne by the Commissary General) are pretty much the same, being between £, 300 and £.400, varying only according to the Prices and Quantities of Stationary, Coals, Candles, &c.

The Pay of the Two Clerks has been augmented f. 100. per Annum from the 7th of June 1799, in lieu of their Fees taken for Searches and Certificates, which it was determined should be discontinued from that Period.

In consequence of the very great Increase of Business in making and answering Searches gratis, an additional Clerk has been allowed to be added to the Annual Estimate, at a Salary of L. So. per Annum from the 7th of June 1799.

The Fees taken by the Two Clerks were £.43. 51. 2d. less in 1797 than in 1795; £.68. 151. 11d. less in 1798 than in 1797; and £.61. 141. 11d. less in 1799 than in 1798.

The Pay and Allowances to the several Deputy Commissaries of Musters at Home and Abroad, amounted in 1797 to £.3,807. 21. 7d. net.

The Deputy Commissaries at Home were suppressed at Midsummer 1798, and those Abroad at Christmas 1793, from which Periods the following retired Allowances have been made to them, to continue during their respective natural Lives; viz.
