HAT by the Act of the Twentieth of Your Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act for taking away and abolishing the Heretable furisdictions in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland; and for making Satisfaction to the Proprietors thereof, and for restoring such Jurisdictions to the Crown; and for mak-

ing more effectual Provision for the Administration of Justice throughout that Part of the United Kingdom by the King's Courts and Judges there; and for obliging all Persons acting as Procurators, Writers, or Agents in the Law in Scotland, to take the Oaths; and for rendering the Union of the Two Kingdoms more complete: It being enacted, That all Heretable Jurisdictions of Justiciary, and all Regalities and Heretable Baillieries, and all Heretable Constabularies, other than the Office of High Constable of Scotland, and all Stewartries, being Parts only of Shires or Countys, and all Sheriffships and

Deputy Sheriffships of Districts, being Parts only of Shires or Countys, within that Part of *Great Britain* called *Scotland*, belonging unto, or possessed or claimed by, any Subject or Subjects; and all Jurisdictions, Powers, Authorities, and Privileges thereunto appurtenant, or annexed or dependent thereupon, shall be, from and after the Twenty fifth Day of *March*, in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and forty eight, abrogated, taken away, and totally dissolved and extinguished.

And it being further enacted. That reasonable and just Compensation and Satisfaction shall be made out of the next Aids to be granted in Parliament, for and in respect of every such Justiciary, Regality, Sheriffship, Deputy Sheriffship, Stewartry, Constabulary, and Bailliary, thereby taken away and dissolved, or resumed and annexed to the Crown, to all and every Person and Persons respectively, who shall appear to be lawfully possessed of any such Justiciary, Regality, Sheriffship, Deputy Sheriffship, Stewartry, Constabulary, or Bailliary; and to every Clerk thereof, who was, on the Eleventh Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and forty six, lawfully possessed for Life of his Clerkship, in case such Office shall be necessarily extinguished in Consequence of this Act.

and it being therein further enacted, That all and every Person and Persons lawfully possessed of any such Justiciary, Regality, Sheriffship, Deputy Sheriffship, Stewartry, Constabulary, Bailliary, or Clerkship, should, on or before the Eleventh Day of November, in the Year of our Lord One thoufand seven hundred and forty seven, make and enter his, her, and their Claim or Claims thereto respectively, in the Court of Seffion in Scotland; and that all fuch Claims or Vouchers produced in Support thereof should be given out in the usual Manner, to His Majesty's Advocate for Scotland, or his Deputy, or to His Majesty's Solicitor General there, who are thereby authorized and required to appear on Behalf of His Majesty, to defend or object against all or any such Claim or Claims, as they shall find Cause to oppose, either in respect of the Validity of the Claimants Title to the Jurisdiction therein fet furth, or of the Value and Price thereof; and that the faid Court of Session should in a summary Way examine the several and respective Titles to the same; and in case they shall find any fuch Person or Persons to have been so lawfully possessed as aforesaid of any such Justiciary, Regality, Sheriffship, Deputy Sheriffship, Stewartry, Constabulary, Bailliary, or Clerk(5)

thip, then the faid Court should, with all Dispatch, consider and declare their Opinion touching the Value and Price thereof, and should cause all such Opinions to be entered in a Roll to be keeped for that Purpose, and make Certificate or Certificates thereof to His Majesty, His Heirs, or Successors, in His or Their Privy Council.

We do therefore most humbly Report and Certify to Your Majesty in Privy Council, That in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, numerous Claims to Heretable Jurisdictions of Justiciary and others in the said Act mentioned, were entered before Us in the Court of Session, on and before the Eleventh Day of November, in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and forty seven: That after hearing Council on Behalf of the Claimants, as also Your Majesty's Advocate on Behalf of the Crown, and due Consideration thereof had, many of these Claims have been dismissed as insufficient, and a good many others have been fustained, and our Opinion declared touching the Value and Price thereof; and such Opinions entered in a Roll or Book keeped for that Purpose, according to the Directions of the Statute.

And we do more particularly most humbly Certify to Your Majesty in Privy Council, That upon the Claims entered by the Persons after-named, for the Heretable Jurisdictions herein after expressed, the Court has adjudged the Claimants to be lawfully possessed of those several Jurisdictions, in Terms of the foresaid Act of Parliament, and have declared their Opinion touching the Value or Price thereof, in Manner underwritten, viz.
