THE Order of the Day, for the House to resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, to consider further of the Report which was made from the Committee appointed to consider of Means for rendering more effectual the Provisions of an Act, made in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His present MAJESTY, intituled, "An Act for better regulating the Affize and making of Bread;" and who were instructed to consider of the most effectual Means of remedying any Inconveniencies which may arise from the Deficiency of the last Crop of Grain, being read;

The House resolved itself into the said Committee, and came to several Resolutions; and directed the Chairman to make several Motions: Which Resolutions and Motions are as followeth:

Resolved,

THAT it is the Opinion of this Committee, That whenever the Average Prices of Wheat and fine Wheaten Flour, ascertained and published in The London Gazette under the Authority of any Act or Acts of Parliament, shall be less than Ninety Shillings.

Shillings per Quarter of Wheat or Sack of Wheaten Flour respectively, there shall be given, on every Quarter of Wheat and on every Barrel of fine Wheaten Flour, which shall be imported into Great Britain from any Port of Europe South of Cape Finisterre, or from any Port in the Mediterranean or in Africa, or from any of His Majesty's Colonies in America, or The United States, before the First Day of October 1800, a Bounty equal to the Difference between such Average Prices in The London Gazette, and Ninety Shillings per Quarter of Wheat, or Barrel of Flour, respectively.

Resolved,
THAT it is the Opinion of this Committee, That whenever the Current Price of Rice imported into this Kingdom, (to be ascertained by the Prices in the London Market,) shall be less than One Pound and Fifteen Shillings per Hundred Weight, there shall be given, on every One Hundred Weight of Rice, imported into Great Britain before the First Day of October 1800, a Bounty equal to the Difference between such Average Price and One Pound Fifteen Shillings.

Resolved,
THAT it is the Opinion of this Committee, That the Duties now payable on Swedish Herrings, dried or cured, imported into this Kingdom, do cease and determine.

Ordered,
THAT the Chairman be directed to move the House, That Leave be given to bring in a Bill to encourage the Cultivation of Potatoes on Waste Lands, for a Time to be limited.

THAT the Chairman be directed to move the House, That Leave be given to bring in a Bill, to explain and amend an Act, made in the Thirty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present MAJESTY, intituled, "An Act for the better Regulation of " Mills."

Ordered,
THAT the Chairman be directed to move the House, That Leave be given to bring in a Bill for better regulating the Price and Affize of Bread.

Ordered,
THAT the Chairman be directed to move the House, That Leave be given to bring in a Bill to prohibit, for a Time to be limited, the Use of Wheat in making Starch.

The Commission on the Administration of Justice, created by the Judiciary Reform Act of 1937, has the honor to submit to you its report. The Commission was organized on July 1, 1937, and has since that time been engaged in a study of the present administration of the Federal courts and of the methods of selecting judges. It has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public. It has also conducted extensive research into the various problems connected with the administration of the Federal courts.

The Commission believes that the present system of selecting judges is not only inefficient but also lacks the confidence of the public. It is, therefore, recommending certain changes which it believes will result in a more efficient and more democratic system. These changes are set forth in detail in the report which is being submitted to you.
