From hence it appears, that if the Article for the Bank, and the Discounts on the Money Payments, had been omitted by Mr. Hutcheson, that then his Valuation of 100l. South Sea Stock would have exceeded D. G. only 9d. and the same, if D. G. had added the Article for the Bank, and deducted the Discounts from his Stock in Hand on the Money Payments.

The said 9d. Difference ariseth thus, viz.

D. G. in the Old Capital, and the New Debts taken in, omits the Fractions of Shillings and Pence, which are included in Mr. Hutcheson's Computations.

D. G. computes Stock for the long and short Annuities of 90l. 98l. and 100l. per Annum, according to the Proposals of the Company for the said different Kinds, and he also makes an Allowance in these, and in the Redeemable Debts for odd Sums under £1. But Mr. Hutcheson makes no Allowance for the odd Sums, and computes Stock for all the Annuities according to the Company's Proposal for those of 100l. per Annum.
