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OLITICK Projectors are a Sort of Profitutes, who feldom come abroad without their Masks; publick Advantage and Utility are the

Shapes in which they usually appear to amuse unwary Gazers, so that like Strumpets too they delude us in the Garb of Innocence. Both wear artificial Countenances, and are careful to conceal their true

true Complections; infomuch that Numbers of unthinking or ignorant People are unwittingly engaged, and become so fond of false Appearances, that they can seldom be persuaded to forbear medling with them, till they have thoroughly burnt their Fingers, and severely smarted for it.

As Beauty is truest discerned in the Mirror of Virtue; so publick Schemes are surest proved by the Touchstone of Truth and Worth; and if the Oar be sound pure in the Resiners Hand, disinterested Zeal, like semale Chastity, will be esteemed above the finest Gold: For Enquiry is the Furnace of Truth, and if the Metal's intrinsick, 'twill be sound free from Dross; but if it prove base, the Vendor should be punished as a gross Impostor.

As Penetration is a Faculty bestowed on few, and Party Prejudice or Affection commonly sway the Multitude, so plausible Appearances contrived with Subtlety, for want of true Discernment, captivate and impose upon wary Minds, and draw them

them to the Tempter's Lure. Gain is the fpecious Bait which Avarice runs away with, and the greedy Populace affected by delusive Prospects of Advantage, eagerly fwallow, and are catched like Gudgeons: The politick Angler has his artificial Flies befides to take the wary Trout, and spreads his fine wrought Nets to circumvent the nobler Prey. Hence the Life of Man is proverbially styled vita piscium; for Power inclines to oppress in every Element, and Force learns from Fraud to entangle where he cannot openly compel. Waryness is a watchful Centinel, and if Travellers would guard against the Lynx, the Crocodile, or Hyæna, they must shun their Purlieus, or be deaf to their delufive Sounds: If Men would not be infulted by Power they must imitate the Sword-fish, and then they may despise the enormous Bulk of the huge Leviathan.

THERE is a Poison in arbitrary Sway which has but one Antidote, and that has often been neglected: If Authority be-

comes

comes exorbitant and oppressive, there are but two Remedies, Flight or Opposition: Private Property is more delicious than Honey in the Palate of Power; but the sedulous Bees always guard against the Incursions of the Wasp, and combine to expel the lazy Drone from their Hive.

Universal Industry is the best Cultor of a Commonwealth; Indolence in a politick Body is like the Palsie in a natural one, which benumbs the Faculties, and renders them useless. Pride is the Cancer of a State which preys upon the tenderest Part, and corrupts the very Breast-Milk, which is Commerce, that should rear up her Children. The Republick of Bees described by Virgil, is a standard Model for the Imitation of Mankind; and

and that delightful Painter has with one Stroke of his Pencil given us a View of his Community, labouring industriously in all its Branches, and every individual Member endeavouring to promote the Welfare and Advantage of the Whole.

The State like a Bark will not kindly work, unless every one on Board occasionally lends an helping Hand; and 'tis abfurd for any to seem careless of the Navigation, under Pretence that they are only Passengers. The Sasety of the Vessel must be the united Care and Concern of all, and without reciprocal Aid it will inevitably perish: The Mariner on the one Hand relies on the Skill and Conduct of the Pilot for Direction of the Course, and for necessary Provision in the Voyage; on the other Hand, without the Pains and Vigilance of the Watch, I doubt the Bark will scarce reach the intended Port.

SO P's Fiction of the War amongst the Members proves, that Government's a Concatenation of mutual Benefits and Dependance, whose Strength is impaired, when any one Link of the Chain is broken; and if the Mouth in the Fable should refuse to let in Sustenance to the Stomach; if the Hand should attempt to destroy the visive Power of the Eye, or the Head

Head and Arms endeavour to debilitate the Legs, the Trunk of the Body must unavoidably fall to the Ground.

It's literally true that Meanness oftentimes is the Support of Grandeur; for as Shakespear quaintly expresses it, "the Pea-"fant treads so close upon the Courtier's "Foot, that he kibes his Heel". The Pride of the Palace is indebted to the Corner-Stone for his Eminence, and a Prince may stand in need of a Cobler for his Wax to draw a Bile: 'Tis by Concurrence and Dependance of Parts that a Fabrick subsists, and where Symmetry and Proportion are observed in the Members, it must be permanent as well as beautiful.

NOTHING is more abfurd than the common Maxims of private Persons in their separate Pursuits of Wealth or Advancement: The mere self-interested Man is a Wretch, that like a murrained Beast, instead of benefiting, will insect the Herd, and therefore should be driven out of the Pasture: There is the same Reason for getting

getting rid of fuch Creatures, as the Countryman has for frighting away the Crows, because they are Carrion that prey upon Industry.

SELF-INTEREST, in the common Acceptation of the Word, is really Nonfense in terminis; for suppose that a Number of wealthy Men should be brought to think and act upon the same narrow Principles and private Views, regardless of the publick Interest, and that such a Number should unfortunately happen to be the major Part of the Senate, as of old in the Roman State, what would become of the Commonwealth? Beyond Dispute it must fink, and be destroyed: And they who contemned the Safety of the publick, in Pursuit of private lucrative Aims, must perish with it, and their Wealth be buried in its Ruins. Suppose a rich Citizen living under a free Government, by whose Constitution his Property is secured under a Guard of wisely established Laws; can fuch a Man have any truer Interest than (9)

the Preservation of that State in its ancient Freedom, when he knows that such Property by any Innovation will be rendered precarious. This would be rational Self-interest, if there is any Reason in the Term; if not, the Name and Practice are equally contemptible.

THE Roman Republick made her felf the Mistress of the World by promoting and encouraging the Virtue of publick Spirit; and whoever tries to explode it, attempts to overturn the Fabrick of Government, as Sampson did the Palace of the Philistines by wresting away the Pillars, and perhaps their Fate may be like his, to be crushed by the Fall.

But Self-Interest and Avarice, the contrast Characters to publick Spirit, are Vices that, like Revenge, bear their own Punishments about them; for Caution being blinded by greedy Lucre, Guile finds Admittance in the Mask of Gain, and perpetrates his Frauds unsuspected and secure: Like Æsop's ravenous Cur, they

quit their Substance to grasp at Shadows, and embarque upon a rotten Bottom to trade at *Terra Incognita*, in Hopes of reaping uncommon Profit by the fairy Traffick.

The memorable Year Twenty produced Thousands, who, Ixion-like, ambitious to embrace a Goddess, pursued a Phantom, and found themselves within a Cloud: Deceipt's a Scorpion, which has no Antidote but Caution, and yet it contains a Remedy for the Mischiess it creates within itself; but the venomous Creature must be destroyed before the Medicine can be applied.

Mischievous Designers ever infinuate themselves into the Unwary and Innocent, as Milton's Fiend glided into Paradise in the Obscurity and Cover of a Mist: Specious Propositions of Advantage should be suspected of the Serpent's Guile, and Jealousy is the best Security in such a dangerous Circumstance: For nothing but the Touch of an Ithuriel's Spear can de-

tect the cloven Foot, and shew the Tempter in his real Shape.

THE politick Schemist, like a Juggler, plays Legerdemain with Mankind, and by deceptio visus dextrously conveys the Properties of others into his own Hands; like the Empirick, he cajoles the Populace with specious Shews and plausible Pretences, while he vends his Quackery for wholesome Medicines; and we are never fatisfied with trying the Skill of State Pretenders to Surgery, till they have drawn all the Teeth out of our Heads. When the Mischief is accomplished Men begin to discern the Cheat; but Pity in such Circumstances is too great a Kindness, and the credulous Trojans, ruined by the Greeks Impostor, only stand as a Caveat in History, to warn fucceeding Nations from incurring the Reproach of fapiunt sero.

EXPERIENCE, though a welcome Guest, is usually the last at an Entertainment; and Retribution rarely obtains the Benefit

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of a Diploma: Ministerial Magick is an occult Science, whose Instruments, like Moles, work in Darkness underground; and countermining is the best Defence, till Time, an able Engineer, shall blow up Fraud, and bring the Truth to Light.

Cuncta aperit secreta dies, ex tempore verum Nascitur, & veniens ætas abscondita pandit.

If there ever was an innate Principle in Man, it must have been the Love of Liberty; and as Reason is bestowed upon him properly to restrain and circumscribe it, so nothing but spontaneous Consent could ever lawfully abridge it: Ubique domi is a Motto which every Citizen of the World has a Right to; and Men by Nature have as indisputable a Claim to traversing the Globe, as to breathing common Air. 'Tis Tyranny to prohibit it, unless it's done by legislative Power, in the Form of common Consent; and even then

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then Men are treated like School-Boys, who are confined to very scanty Bounds. It's a Matter of Mirth and Ridicule, more than serious Argument, to see a few Posfessors of small Spots of Earth, quarter out and divide the whole Orb amongst them; closet up (as it were) the greater Part, as if they would referve it to themselves, and perhaps, in order only to supply their Nicknackitories with Rarities: Exclusive Charters are the modern Cookery of Trade, but the Dish does not altogether relish, because our Neighbours have monopolized the Spice; and, in Reality, I question much if any Ruler in the World has a Right in himself; and consequently whether he can delegate an exclusive Power of Traffick to others. The Monarch of Spain took a Fancy to America, and butchered a Million of poor Wretches to obtain it. The Dutch loved their Pottage well seafoned, and so got Possession of Java, Borneo, and Ceylon, (three of the largest Islands in the World, excepting Calephornio

and Madagascar) and thereby ingrossed the Pepper Trade to themselves. The French had a little more Modesty, and were content to go Snacks with the English, in forting out the Territories of the Great Mogul. The Emperor bartered away his Birth-right pragmatically. The Danes got a Snip, and King John of Portugal's Mouth waters to taste of the Fare, upon hearing it commended. But it is not at all furprizing to fee Power elbowing her Neighbours, and grasping at new Dominions; it's rather wonderful to observe them selling their Acquisitions like Cattle at a Market. Denmark affords a flagrant Instance of it; she robbed the Minor King of Sweden of two valuable Possessions Bremen and Vehrden, and mortgaged them so deep as to endanger a Foreclosure; and Charles the Second of England fold the India Charter of 1661 to a Body of Merchants for a Sum of Money to fupply his Courtezans: The Preamble to the Grant contains in it so much Fustian and Cant, that the gravest Person cannot read

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read it without laughing; and therefore I recommend it as a Supplement to a Book entitled, Pills to purge Melancholy.

GRANTS of Importation in Trade from a Prince to a felect Number of his Subjects, more especially for a Price, is selling the Liberty and natural Rights of all his People to a few, and erecting a Miniature of Tyranny in the Body of a Commonwealth, which, like a Polypus in the humane Constitution, must in Time destroy it by interrupting the vital pulsative Motion or Systole and Diastole of the Politick Heart: The South-Sea Hydra is a Conviction of this Argument; and not more than twelve Years fince, like a Dropfie in the State, they turned pretended Nutriment into liquid Element, and frequent Tapping is the only Regimen that can preserve Life in such a Case. The erecting that Corporation was a scandalous Chicane: The Debenture Estates, anticipated by the Scheme, owe their Rife to Land Pyracy; and that burlesque Body of Trade

having

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having lately committed an Overt-Act of Bankruptcy refort to a Spunge to wipe out the Score. When an Annihilation of the Body is become an established Doctrine, it is tacitly confessed that there is no Soul; and this fingle Comment may serve as an Abridgement of that Corporation's Annal for the Year 1732. For a Century past unhappy Credit has been metamorphofed into an empty Bubble, blown up by Fraud, sustained by Power, and fleets in Air through Ignorance; like Ovid's Virgin Echo pursued by pilsering Pan, 'tis dwindled into little but a Name, Vox & præterea nibil. Ægypt was plagued with Locusts, Byzantium is seldom without a Pestilence, and England is infested with leachy Stockjobbers and Brokers; like Barnacles about a Whale, they fubfift by preying on the Body, and are a Species in the Creation as despicable as the Gnat, who's only known by doing Mischief, and rues the only Remedy. Brokers are to Companies what Puffs and Setters are to Sharpers;

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Sharpers; and fair Traders wonder as much at fuch Creatures being licensed in a free State, as Passengers in a Caravansary would to fee a Patent to authorize a Banditti: It's a Blemish in the Reign of Elizabeth, that she granted the first India Charter, which was 131 Years ago; and her Favourite Leicester led her into the Mistake, and that's the secret Reason why the then distressed States of Holland could not bear him as a Viceroy; and James her Successor renewed the Charter at the mercenary Instigation of his Favourite, Stenny Villers Duke of Buckingham. Clifford of the Cabal in Charles the Second's Reign, notorious in History for introducing Member-Markets, helped to exchange the India for the Drury Commerce, and Cleveland, Gwin, and Portsmouth emulated for the Golden Prize: King James gave a Charter, as he thought, for making Proselytes; and Ranelaugh persuaded cautious King William not to innovate, and was confidered for his Pains. WHEN

When Queen Anne succeeded, this great mercantile Body, so uplifted and supported, trusting to State-walking Staffs, lost the Use of its own Limbs, and tumbled to the Ground: A spurious Phœnix arose forthwith from its Ruins; the Body became Bankrupt; a sort of Assignees bought the Goods, and the Tripartite Indenture of 1703 gave a Sanction to the Bargain; three Years since the injurious Lease of separate Commerce expired, and Hope produced a Glimmering of Redress, but Power entered and extinguished it.

It's a Paradox to suppose that any one can give more than he is possessed of. Calls of Companies are despotick; for if the Prince has no Right to seize six and a Quarter out of the Hundred in my Estate, how can a Parcel of petty Merchants, delegated by him, scotch off so much per Cent. from my Credits in a Reckoning?

It's a Million of Pities that fair and kind Credulity should be abused; Innocence

is fo delightful and pleafing a Personage, that Bravery blushes to see her ravished: especially when the Sword is rusty in the Scabbard, and they who would affift her cannot exert the Gallantry that's necessary in her Defence. Who is there that has a Soul can bear to behold lovely Virtue in Diftress? what Man of Spirit would not try to rescue her? and give me Leave to fay, that refigned Simplicity and conscious Integrity in Men should be deplored or asfisted in Danger, equally with defenceless Women; and they who are strictly found and independent, may fay that both may critically be faved. I begin to be shocked at what I see, for the Iron Age seems about to revolve, and there is nothing but the Rainbow to fignify that there will not be another Deluge. The Gods met in Council upon that grand Criterion, and refolved upon fending Destruction to Mankind; because Corruption had entered so far as to mortify; and in fuch a Cafe Amputation is a Godlike great Prescription. How im-D 2 pudent

pudent would a Beggar appear before a Magistrate, who should shew a Pistol while he is asking Alms; and how preposterous would it be for Officers of a Parish to contrive a charitable Sermon under Pretence of Kindness to poor distressed People, and leave them destitute of the Loaves, while they sled away with the Bread and Fishes too?

with Art and Industry (Money so much now esteemed) into real Contempt; his Precepts and Example remained prevalent for 500 Years; and Agis, like Harry the Seventh, innovated and abolished the noble Pattern of his Ancestor; Corruption and most dark and base Desire entered with that Innovation; and Lacedæmon samed so long for liberal Arts and incontested Bravery, was sold for a Price; to tell the Tale is renovare dolorem. History in Point of Morals is like a Chart in Mercator sailing, and it is designed to kindly tell us how we may avoid the Rocks and Shoals: I am sorry

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to think how many fair unhappy Innocents, as well as many honest worthy Men for want of proper Pilots, have been lately run-a-Ground.

I know the Law of Nature; I have examined the Law of Nations, and civil and Statute Laws; but neither Justinian in his Codes nor the celebrated Domat make any Mention of By-Laws: A Prince who grants such a Power to a Company, signs a Carte Blanche to an Usurer, and sisteen or twenty per Cent. instead of sive, is taken under the ridiculous Mock-name of Indulgence.

The Statute Laws of Britain express, that no Lord of the Manor can turn or obstruct a Road without a Writ of ad quod damnum, to enquire what Prejudice may accrue to the Copyhold Tenant thereby; and is it not absurd then that the French Monarch should set up a Turnpike to obstruct Travellers in the Way to Messissippi; that the King of Spain won't let any one be so complaisant as to

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pay a Visit to the Yncas of Mexico and Peru; that the Dutch serve the Kings of Borneo, Java and Ceylon like the Prince of Siam (who is kept shut up in a Box;) that Virtuoso's cannot go to see the Curiosities of the Mogul's Court, or the Merchant deal at Byenos Ayres Market without taking their Passages in the Caravansaries of Eroad-Street or Leaden-Hall, and paying exorbitant Prices for a Passage?

GUY of Warwick and Bellianis of Greece, lose their Fame in Chivalry, compared with these Atchievers: But Pope Dominicus carried up the Joke still higher, and possessed himself of all the Avenues and Roads to the Land of Canaan, insomuch, that his Successors pretend that none can get Admittance for a little Milk and Honey, without an Imposition of Pence to turn St. Peter's Key.

Mahomet also formed a gallant Scheme of turning all the Roads to Elyzium into one, and made the Passage to his Favou-

rite Alhi through his own Arabia Felix; and it's Pity but he had sooner been sufpended between Heaven and Earth for his Pains.

THE Council of Beasts in the Fable assembled about the Julian Æra to canton out the Globe. In the Result it appeared, that the Lion and the Leopard, the Bear and the Fox, engrossed the chief Parts; but before they departed, the Eagle darted down upon the Map, carried it away in his Claws, and destoyed the geometrical Scheme.

Væ miseros! si rursum advenient dirique cometæ.

Not one Charter granted to the India Company confers a regal Power, and in their corporate Capacity they are but Subjects even in India No Authority but the Crown can feize by Extent; and yet I aver that mercantile Body has prefumed to take the fovereign Style abroad, and fend their

their Mandates forth as peremptory as the thirty Tyrants of Greece, although the royal Flag was all the while displayed: Delegated Power is a Child that first wants leading Strings, and affects to go a highlone when he's out of the Nurse's Sight; and thus these Companies get the Rickets.

I KNEW an artful Gamester abroad, who punting at Basset, found his Bank in Danger of sinking, and therefore swept the Board; but the injured Parties soon tript bim up for his Pains.

DEPUTED Power, like a Stilliard, is defigned for certain necessary Uses; but the further the Weight is removed from the Hand, the Balance is more uncertain. The Jugurthine War arose from delegated Powers, which, Distance savouring, made the State that gave the Authority tremble: The Imperial Monarch declined by granting Sorts of distant Viceroyships, and Ruit molet sud was a proper Motto. The antique Sibyls Leaves record the following ominous Words,

When Time grows hoary, Britain's Isle shall claim
For Arms and Arts the Preference in Fame:
Successive Scenes to Base transform the Bold,
And all intrinsick Worth be truck'd for Gold:
Guard then, ye Brave, whom none but Fraud can hurt;

Rome too must sink, in Rapine grown expert.

According to our Laws Bond Creditors are entitled to a Priority in Payment to Notes or Book Debts; and a private Merchant, who engages in Credit by Obligations of Penalty to the Tantamount of his Capital, in Case of Bankruptcy or Mortality, must at best appear indiscreet, and will be shrewdly suspected of unjust E. Inten-

Intentions to his Note and Book-Debt Creditors.

What Dependance can there be upon Statute Laws, if little trifling Corporation illegitimate By-Laws can, in strange Defiance to legislative Authority, prescribe instead of following a wholesome Regimen; and when I see them so employed, my Lord Rochester comes to Mind, and I conceive the ludricous Idea of his vending Powder of Post, with this Exception, that his proceeded from Wit and Humour; whereas these People have no Wit, but dogmatically insist to be humoured.——Risum teneatis amici?

If Statute-Laws inflict the Penalties of Extortion upon accepting more than five per Cent. of Interest at this Time, why is there not an equal Refuge for the Subject, to prevent Compulsion in obliging him to take involuntarily Loss? Common Law affords Relief for a single Subject in these penal Obligations; 'tis an Overt-act of Bankruptcy to elude Payment of a lawful youch-

ed Demand, and Companies or their Managers should consider that they have no just Pretensions to greater Privileges than a private Subject; and the strongest Proof that I will give at present is, that about two and thirty Years ago the Creditors of the old insolvent East-India Company sued out many Processes for Recovery of their Bond Debts, which were at fifty per Cent. Discount; And let the Juglers of that accommodated Difference declare, if they could ever engage in Law otherwise than, quasi Societas privatim constructa, nequaquam collective, sed singulariter, equasi unicus vir in oppugnatione contra viros.

The fly Design produced of late for lowering Interest extrajudicially, was artfully contrived, but indiscreetly produced: The Project was brought over from a Country, where Impositions are so plenteous, that General Excise is too saint an Expression to describe them. Of late our Countrymen have affected much to sollow foreign Fashions; but by that Means Vir-

Threadbare like an antiquated Dress, and, as I am told, is bought by a Salesman for an inconsiderable Price. —— Pudeat an? Si non, certam te cito pudesse.

By all the Observation which I have been able to make in the Course of nineteen Years Experience, I will only remark that a Stock of thirty Millions is not fo foon fquandered as three; and though a Physician may have one Patient ill of the Dropfy, another troubled with a Polypus, and a third in Danger from a Consumption, yet the Case of all may be desperate; and the only Difference is, that fudden Death may be expected to happen to some, and others by a flattering Distemper may die by the Inch. The State Surgeon who asks no Fee, and yet is anxious to heal, will feldom have his Skill suspected, or his Help refused.

Publick Spirit has complicated Virtues, and one effential Quality is a communicative Disposition, that is conjunct to the very

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very Humanity of our Natures; letting our Neighbours fee by our Lamps, feldom wastes or absorbs the Oil: Cicero's Maxim was, Quicquid sine detrimento possit commodari, tribuetur vel ignoto.

This is the Motive to my Publication, and the only one; for I look upon hireling Pens like Swifs Troops, who bear the same Motto of point Swiss, point l'Argent; and the fame Coat in Heraldry, which confifts of the Fields Or and Argent; but they have no Relation to mine which contains the Gules. And in Reality I almost dishonour the gallant Swedish Nation by the Comparison; for the Swedes, though they fight for Pay, ever merit it by their Service; but these Wretches, like Jackals, are fed for Catering for their Master, and vet starve his Cause. As for my part, I have no Reserves but what some small Share perhaps of Prudence renders necesary. Whoever I am, I neither want nor abound; I have neither Fear nor Con-

tempt

tempt in my Composition; I revere the Laws, and I know how to keep within that sacred Asylum. It's in my Nature neither to boast, nor to presume to instruct; but an ordinary Head may give a Hint, and if it is not taken, there's no Detriment; but this Reslection then must naturally ensue, Si populus vult decipi, decipiatur.

I SHALL only add, that, like a fair Trader, if the Reader likes his Pattern of what Goods I shew bim, he may have more from the same Stock. And now I'll conclude with Part of Ovid's Peroratio, Jamque opus exegi; with a non obstante to a second Course, if my Guests like the first Dish, which I have thus served up at the publick Table; and if the Taster happens to please the Palate, there's a whole Pipe ready to draw off,

CICERO, who faved the Roman Republick by his Skill and Integrity in the very Agonies of the Cataline Confusion, prescribes

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prescribes this salutary Maxim for the Observation of his Countrymen whom he had at Heart, Nibil honestum esse potest justisa quod vacat. It's a Joke for People to talk of Honesty, if they don't administer Justice.
