

By the COMMISSIONERS and TRUSTEES appointed by His MAJESTY'S Letters Patents, for Improving Fisheries and Manufactures in Scotland.



HEREAS, in Pursuance of an Act past in the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George I. of Glorious Memory, Intitled, [An Act for Encouraging and Promoting Fisheries, and other Manufactures and Improvements in that Part of Great

Britain, called Scotland Whereby it was provided, That it should and might be lawful for His Majesty, his Heirs and Successors, by Letters Patents, under the Great Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be

be kept in Scotland, in place of the Great Seal thereof, to lay down, settle and establish a particular Plan or Method, and to fix and direct proper Rules and Regulations, whereby the several Funds and Sums of Money provided and grown due, for the Improvement and Encouragement of Fisheries and Manufastures in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, should be wholly applied, laid out, and distributed, according to the Tenor and true Meaning of the faid 15th Article of the Treaty of Union, and for Improvement of Fisheries and such other Manufactures in Scotland, as may most conduce to the general Good of the united Kingdom, and to no other Use, Intent, or Purpose whatsoever; And that it should and might be lawful for His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, by Letters Patents, under the Scal aforesaid, to appoint, name and authorize any Number of Persons resignt in that Part of Great Britain, called Scotland, not exceeding the Number of Twenty one to be Commissioners and Trustees for managing and directing the Application of the faid Sums, according to the Plan or Method that should be settled or established as aforesaid, and for executing the several Powers and Authorities, which by the said Letters Patents should to them be committed by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors;

Ir has pleased Our most Gracious Sovereign, by his Letters Patents, passed under the Great Seal aforesaid, to declare, That it is His Royal Will and Pleasure, that the Interest of the Sum of L. 14000, provided by the 15th Article of the Treaty of Union, for Encouraging and Promoting the Manusacture of Coarse Wool in Scotland, be annually applied for Encouraging the Spining and Manusacturing of Coarse Wool within the Shires of Berwick, Roxburgh, Sal-

kirk, Peebles, Lanerk, Air, Wigtoun, Dumfries, Edinburgh and Stirling, and within the Stewartries of Annandale and Kirkeudbright, or any other Shire or Stewartry, where large Quantities of Coarse Wool. commonly called and known by the Name of Tarr'd Wool are produced; and to authorize the Commissieners and Trustees nominated in the said Letters Patents to settle a particular Plan or Methed for distributing the Sum intended for promoting the said Manufacture; and that the yearly Interest of the Sum of L. 6000, as Part of the Arrears of the Annuity of L. 2000 per annum, provided by the Act of the 5th of his late Majesty King George I. together with the said Annuity of L. 2000, and the Surplus of the Malt-Duty yearly and each Year be laid out, and wholly applied towards the Encouraging of the Herring Fishery, and of the Linnen and Hempen Manufactures, in that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, by equal Portions, so as that the One half of the faid yearly Sums, shall be applied towards the Encouraging of the faid Fisheries, and the other half shall be applied towards the Encouraging of the said Linnen and Hempen Manufactures.

A ND that out of the yearly Sum alloted and appropriated for the Improvement of Fisheries, a Sum not exceeding L. 2340, shall be annually distributed in Pramiums, after the Rate of 40 Shillings per Last, upon the Tonnage of the Vessel, to such Persons as shall contract for fitting out Bushes for the Herring Fishing in deep Water, upon the Conditions, and under the Regulations to be settled by the Trustees or Commissioners, nominated and appointed by the said Letters Patents.

AND that a Sum not exceeding L. 100, be yearly distributed in small Prizes to such Fishermen

as shall make the first Discovery of Herrings coming upon the Coast, according to the Rules to be settled in like Manner by the said Trustees.

A N D that a Sum not exceeding L. 100, be annually given for Salaries to Wreck or Cure Masters.

to be nominated by the said Trustees.

A ND that a Sum not exceeding L. 110 be granted annually for Salaries to two riding Officers, to furvey, examine and check the Conduct of the Wreck and Cure Masters, and to prevent Fraud in the Fish-

ing Trade, and the same and the same

And that out of the yearly Sums alloted for the Improvement of Linnen and Hempen Manufactures, a Sum not exceeding L. 1500, shall be annually distributed in Præmiums after the Rate of 15 Shill, an Acre, to such Persons as shall dress and prepare their Grounds, and shall therein Sow Lint-seed or Hemp-seed in the Manner, and according to the Rules and Regulations to be published by the said Trustees.

AND that a Sum not exceeding L. 400 be annually granted for Salaries to Lappers and Stamp-

masters, at the Rate of L. 10 per Ricce.

A No that a Sum not exceeding L. 250 be annually allowed as Salaries to Two General riding Officers, who are to examine into the Conduct of the Lappers.

AND that a Sum not exceeding L. 100 be annually allowed for carrying on Profecutions against fuch Persons as shall transgress the Laws relating to

the Linnen and Hempen Manufactures.

AND that a Sum not exceeding L. 150, be annually allowed for encouraging Spining-Schools, to teach Children from the Age of Eight, to that of Fourteen Years, to spin.

A ND that a Sum not exceeding L. 50, be annually allowed for procuring Models of the best Sorts of Looms, and other Instruments for Improving the Linnen and Hempen Manusactures.

AND that a Sum not exceeding L. 200, be annually distributed to House-Wives, who shall make the best Piece of Linnen Cloth, according to the Directions of the said Commissioners and Trustees.

AND that the said Commissioners and Trustees do, as foon as conveniently may be, take into their Confideration the State of the several Funds and Sums of Money, granted for the Encouragement of Filberies and Manufactures, and do make an Estimate of the Amount thereof; and if the yearly Amount thereof shall appear sufficient to answer the several Purposes aforesaid in their full Extent, That the said Commissioners and Trustees, do frame and settle a particular Plan or Method for the Distribution of the faid Monies in the Manner above-mentioned; and if the said yearly Funds shall not appear sufficient to answer the said Purposes to the full Extent, the faid Commissioners and Trustees do propose another Plan of Distribution answerable to the clear Sums that the yearly Funds may produce, still preserving the Quantum of the particular Encouragement for each Teveral Purpose.

And that the particular Plan or Method for distributing the foresaid Præmiums for sitting out of Bulbes, and preparing Ground for sowing Lint-Seed and Hemp-Seed, be so conceived, as the Undertakers for either may have the said Encouragement continued to them for the Space of Three successive

Years.

AND

AND that the said Commissioners and Trustees, or any Five or more of them, be empowered, as by the

the said Letters Patents they are impowered and required, to propose such Regulations, as to them shall seem necessary or expedient, as Conditions upon which the several Pramiums and Encouragements shall be answered, such Regulations being always consistent with the Laws of the Realm, and the said Letters Patents.

And that so soon as the said particular Plan or Method of Distribution, together with the several Conditions upon which the above Praintings are to be paid, shall be prepared and settled the same, shall be forthwith published, by affixing Copies thereof on the Market-Cross of Edinburgh, and Peir and Shore of Leith, and by transmitting Copies thereof to the Magistrates of every Royal-Burrow in Scotland, and to the Sheriff and Stewart-Clerk of each Shire and Stewartry within the same, to the End all Persons may have sufficient Notice, and thereby may have an Opportunity of undertaking the several Improvements proposed.

THE Commissioners and Trustees, nominated and appointed by the said Letters Patents, having, in Obedience to His Majesty's Commands, taken into Consideration the State of the Funds and Sums of Money before-mentioned, are of Opinion, that these Funds and Sums of Money will answer His Majesty's most gracious Intentions; Therefore, they hereby Declare and Publish, That for the Term of Three Years, from and after the Feast of Christmas next, the subsequent Sums of Money shall be annually laid out and applied, viz.

ACCOUNT OF THE SECOND OF THE S

Regulations of the Herring Fishery, and Conditions upon which the said Præmiums are to be paid.

I. HE exact Burden of each Bush shall be computed by a Person to be nominated and appointed by the Trustees, according to the common Rule of Computation, formed upon the Dimensions of Length over Stern and Steven, Breadth in the

Beam, and Depth in the Hould.

II. EACH Bush shall be a free British Bottom of Burden, not under 30, nor above 50 Lasts, the Freedom to be vouched by the Carpenter's Bill of Sale, if British built, or an authentick Extract of the Registration, if a foreign built Ship, made free, and the Burden, by Certificate from the Person, who shall be nominated and appointed to measure, and to compute the same.

III. Each Bush shall set out to the Herring Fishing from some Port in Scotland, shall be vietualed there, and shall also be there provided with Nets, Ropes, Salt, Cask, and all other Fishing Equipage and Materials, and one Half of the Crew at least shall be British Subjects, to be vouched by Certificate from the Chief Magistrate of the Place or Places whence the Bush sets out, at which she is victualed, and where she is provided with Fishing Equipage and Materials.

IV. THE Fishing Equipage, of Nets, Ropes, &c. and Materials of Salt and Cask, shall be good and sufficient of their Kind, and adjusted to the Burden of

the Bush as to Quantity, in such Proportion as shall be specified in the Contract, Deed, or Writing, to be drawn up betwixt the Trustees and the Undertakers, and shall be vouched by Certificate from such Persons, as the Trustees shall authorise and appoint to inspect and examine the Quantity and Quality of the said Fishing Equipage and Materials.

V. All the Bushes shall set out from the respective Ports, where they shall be victualed and equipt, before the 5th of June annually at the latest, and shall rendezvouze at Brassie-sound in Zetland, on or before the 1 rth Day of the said Month, Wind and Weather serving, to be vouched by Certificate from the Person who shall be nominated and appointed by the Trustees to review them on that Day, and in that Place.

EACH Bush shall fish from Brasse Sound towards the Orkney Islands, and from the Latitude of the said Islands, Southward, along the Coast of Scotland, within Sight of Land, unless driven off by Stress of Weather, and shall continue Fishing from the said 11th of June to the 11th of September, or till a full Loading of Herrings shall be caught, to be vouched as to the Time of Fishing by the Master or Steers-man's Journal; and as to the Quantity of Herrings caught by Certificate from the Cure Masters and General Surveyor of the Place or Places where the Henrings are unloaded and repacked.

VII. THE Steers man or Master of each Bush shall keep an exact fournal of all Occurences and Proceedings, mentioning particularly how many Times he put into Port, on what Occasion, how long he stay'd in Port each Time, what Bushes he spoke at Sea, and the Numbers of Bushes which at any Time were in Sight at once, according to a Form to be

drawn up by the Trustees, and put into his Hands; which Fournal shall not only be verrified by his own, but also by the Crews Oaths, if required; and he shall also conform himself to, and puctually obey fuch particular Instructions as the Trustees shall from Time to Time give, concerning the proper Method of Fishing.

VIII. No Herrings that have been caught in Nets, above 24 Hours, commonly called Hanged Herrings, shall be mixed with Live Herrings, but shall be put up in Casks having the Letters H. D. marked upon them, at the Time of salting and packing,

under the Penalty of Forfeiture.

IX. ALL Bush Herrings shall be gutted with a Knife, in the Manner practifed by the Hollanders, shall be sorted carefully into Fat Herrings, Full Herrings, and Spawn'd Herrings, shall be salted with a competent Quantity of Salt, and shall be packed up in Barrels, having at least 16 Hoops of 32 Gallons; or half Barrels, having at least 12 Hoops of 16 Gallons English Wine Measure, unless designed for Home Conjumpt, in which Case only they may be packed in Firkins or Quarter Barrels of 8 Gallons Measure soresaid, to be vouched by Certificate from the Wreck or Cure Master and General Sur-

X. ALL Herrings adjuged by the Wreck or Cure Master to be so insufficent as not to be Marketable shall be immediately thrown into the Sea, at such Distance from the Shoar, as that they cannot be ga-

thered up.

XI. IT shall not be lawful for any Bush to deliver over Herrings at Sea into any Vessel other than a Bush, neither shall it be lawful for any Bush to sarry Herrings to any Market or Place of Sale until they shall first have been landed in Scotland; neither shall it be lawful to remove them from the Place, where they shall first have been landed, until they shall be repacked and daunted in the Manner after mentioned, till they shall be inspected by the Cure Masters, and until the Wreck or Cure Master shall have stamped the Name of the Place, where they were repacked, upon each Barrel with a bot Iron.

XII. No Herrings shall be repacked till they have lyen at least 14 Days in Salt, so much time being requisite for Pineing them sufficiently; neither shall any repacked Herrings be Pickled with any other than new made Pickle, unless it be well cleaned from Scales by Straining, or refined by Boiling.

XIII. ALL Herrings packed at Sea, commonly called Sea Steeks, shall be wholly turned over into Tubs, together with their Pickle, in order to their being Washed and thorowly Inspected, before they be repacked; and in repacking them it shall be observed as an indispensible Rule to spread two Handfuls of clean Salt on the Bottom of the Barrel, and to lay the Herrings closs together, putting four Head Herrings in each Layer, and a Handful of clean Salt betwixt every Layer, and two Handfuls one the Top, and likewife to daunt them twice when the Barrel is two thirds filled, and when full.

XIV. ALL Bush Herrings shall be repacked by Workmen appointed for that Purpose, who shall either take an Oath of Fidelity, or find Security for their punctual Observance of the said Rules in repacking.

XV. Such Persons as design to be Adventurers in the Bush Fishing next Season, shall signifie their Intention, by a Writing under their Hands, on or

be-

before the 25th Day of January next, directed to David Flint Secretary to the Trustees; and shall make Offer of entering into Contract with the Trustees, for the Three next ensuing Fishing Seasons successively, by which Contracts the Trustees shall be obliged to pay the foresaid Pramium annually, in Manner aftermentioned.

XVI. The Adventurers in the Bush Fishing, who shall enter into Contrast as aforesaid, shall be entitled to the Præmium, upon Production of the Vouchers hereby required, of their having observed the Regulations, and performed the Conditions before specified; and it shall be paid them within Forty Days after the Vouchers are delivered in at the Trustee's Office in Edinburgh, to any Person duly authorized to receive the same, providing no Fraud be sound to have been committed in procuring the said Vouchers, within the Time foresaid; as to which Frauds the Trustees reserve to themselves Liberty and Power of Expiscation, by the Oaths of credible Witnesses.

Any Bush sitted out, tackled, and provided as assorbaid, and actually employed in the Herring. Fishing, that shall, during the Fishing Season, perish at Sea, by Stress of Weather, or other Fatality, betsore the Herrings caught can be laid on Land, in Manner abovementioned, or shall be lost to the Proprietors by Capture, the Pramium abovementioned for that Fishing Season, shall nevertheless be answered to the Undertakers.

THE Sum of L. 100, appointed to be given in Præmiums, for discovering Shoals of Herrings in the Coast Fishing, shall be divided as follows, viz.

In the Firth of Forth, Four Boats shall be employed in searching for Shoals of Herrings, from the 15th of July to the 15th of September annually, viz. Two on the North Side in the Fishing Stations of Old-Hecks, Crail-Wyk, Kilrenny-Wyk, Anstruther-Traith, Pittenweem-Traith, St. Mennins-Traith, and Island of May-Bank, and Two on the South side in the Stations of Whitecove, Reed-Castle, Bass-Foot, and Northberwick Traith. The Time of Search shall be every alternate Day, from the 15th of July to the 5th of August for the Float Drave, and in like Manner for the Ground Drave from the said 5th of August to the said 15th of September during the Neep Tides.

The Pramium to each Boat shall be Six Shilings each Day, while employed in the Search of Herrings, as before mentioned, until a Shoal of Herrings shall be discovered on the Ground; and a Pramium of L. 3 Sterl. shall be given to the Boat's Crew that shall find out Herrings on the Ground in such Numbers, that a Boat's full Loading shall have been caught, either by themselves, or by any other Boat's Crew, and shall give the first Notice thereof, to any of the

THE

Persons employed to distribute the said Pramiums; and if the first Shoal of Herrings go off before all the Cask and Salt provided for the Fishing of that Season be used, then the Search shall recommence and continue till a second Discovery be made of Herrings on the Ground, and so forth till the Fishing Season be ended; the said Pramium of L. 3 being to be paid to the successive Discoverers, till the Sum of L: 12 is expended.

In the Firth of Marray, Three Boats shall be employed likewise, from the 15th of July to the 15th September annually, viz. Two on the North Side, in the Stations of Tarbet-Ness, Cromarty-Bay, and Channery-Loch, and one Boat on the South Side, in the Stations of Findborn and Nairn-Traiths; the Time of Search shall be in like Manner every alternate Day. from the 15th of July to the 5th of August for the Float Drave, and in like Manner for the Ground Drave, from the said 5th of August to the said 15th of September, during the Neep Tides; the Præmium to each Boat shall be Five Shillings each Day, while employed in the same Manner, as mentioned for the Firth of Forth, and a Præmium of Twenty Pounds Scots Money to the Boat's Crew, which shall give the first Account, to any of the Persons employed to distribute the Pramiums, of a Shoal of Herrings being on the Ground, in such Numbers that a Beat's full Loading thereof shall have been caught, either. by themselves, or by any other Boat's Crew, till the Sum of L. 5. be exhausted, in the same Way and Manner as directed for the Firth of Forth.

In the Firth of Clyde, Two large Boats shall be employed, viz. One in the Station of Air-Traith, and the other in the Station of Bute-Traith; the Time of Search shall be likewise every alternate Day

from the 15th of May to the 15th of November, the Pramium to each Boat shall be Seven Shillings stert. each Day, when unsuccessful in discovering a Shoal of Herrings, and Forty Shillings to each Boat, which shall give the first Account to the proper Persons of a Shoal of Herrings, so as a Boat's full Loading thereof shall be caught either by themselves or any other Boat's Crew, till the Sum of Six Pounds Sterl. shall

be expended.

In the Firth of Solway, three Boats of Burden, Tons each at least, shall be equipt with Nets, shall be provided with skilful Crews, and shall be employed affiduously every Day in searching for and catching Herrings, betwixt Blackshaw and the River Esk, from the 1st of May to the 11 of June annually, for the Term of three Years, from and after the Feast of Christmas next; the Præmium for each Boat shall be L. 8 Sterl. and shall be paid at Midsummer annually, upon a Certificate from the Magiltrates of the Burgh of Annan, certifying, That the Boat's Burden is at least 5 Ton; That the Fishing Equipage was good; That at least one Third Part of the Crew were skilful Fishermen, and that they have been affiduously employed in searching for, and catching Herrings, during the Time foresaid.

THE Distribution of the Pramium, alloted to the Firth of Forth, shall be committed to the Magistrates of the Burghs of Anstruther-Easter and Crail on the North-side, and to the Magistrates of the Burghs of Dunbar and North-Berwick on the South-side, each having the Direction of one Boat; The Distribution thereof, in the Firth of Murray, shall be committed to the Magistrates of the Burghs of Inverness, Nairn and Fortrose, each having likewise the Direction of one Boat; and the Distribution in the Firth of Chydes

to the Magistrates of Air and Rothesay, each having the Direction of one Boat, under such Conditions as Regulations, as the Trustees shall lay down an prescribe, on or before the sirst Day of June next. The two Riding Officers, and the Ten Wree or Cure-Masters, who shall be named, and several stationed afterwards, shall find Security for the Fidelity, viz. each of the Riding Officers to the Amount of L. 200 Sterl. and each of the Wreck Cure-Masters, to the Amount of L. 50 Sterl. Impr. HAT whoever intends to contract for sowing one Acre or more, with Lint-Seed or Hemp-Seed, in order to be entitled to the said Præmium of 15 Shil. per Acre for the next three successive Years, do give Notice of his Proposal or Inin Writing under his Hand, directed to David Flint, Secretary to the Commissioners and Trustees, at their Office in Edinburgh, or to the Clerks of the Justices of Peace for the Shires and Stewartries after-mentioned, distinctly expressing the Undertaker's Name and Designation, the Place of his Residence, and the Name of the Farm in which the said Seed is to be sown, with the Name of the Parish, and of the Shire or Stewartry where the Farm lies, specifying the Number of Acres he designs to sow, and whether he designs to contract for One, Two, or the whole Three Years, in the Form hereto subjoin'd.

II. THAT no Proposal be for less than one Acre, for the Undertaker's own Behoof.

III. THAT if more Undertakers, out of any one Shire or Stewartry, shall offer than there are Acres, which fall to the Share or Proportion of such Shire or Stewartry, allowing one Acre to each Offerer, the Preference shall be determined by Lot.

IV. THAT if there shall not be so many Offerers, as there are single Acres to be improved in any Shire or Stewartry, the remaining Acres shall be divided by Lot amongst such Persons, within the Shire or Stewartry, as propose to improve more Acres than one.

V. That if the Share or Proportion of any Shire or Stewartry, shall not be exhausted by Undertakers within the said Shire or Stewartry, the Overplus shall be divided by Lot amongst the Undertakers, for single Acres, in other Shires or Stewartries, who may have been excluded by Lot within their respective Shires or Stewartries; And if there shall be still an Overplus, it shall, in like Manner, be divided amongst those, who got sewer Acres than what they offered to contract for.

VI. THAT the Offerer preferred, for the first Year purchase and sow only foreign Seed; and in the Oath herein after-mentioned, express the Quantity bought, and by whom the same was imported into Scotland, from what Country, and of what Year's Growth.

VII. THAT every Person, who shall be preferred for one Acre or more, for sowing Lint-Seed, and who shall make no Demand for any Præmium for Hemp, shall be obliged however to sow as many Falls, i. e. Six Ells square with Hemp-Seed, as he undertakes and sows Acres with Lint-Seed, the said Falls, or Six Ells square, always being reckoned Part of the Acres to which he is preserred.

VIII. THAT the Undertakers, for the Years 1729 and 1730, be obliged to dress their Grounds according to one or other of the Methods mentioned in a Treatise, containing the different approved Methods of to be published

by Order of the Trustees.

X. THAT they do not Water the Lint produced in the said Grounds in any Pit or Hole, in which another Quantity of Lint has been watered that Seafon, or the former Year, unless the same be so disposed as to be refreshed with running Water from some Spring, River or Rivulet.

XI. THAT seeing the Trustees have it in View to employ some skilful Flax Dressers, who shall undertake to dress the Lint in a much better Method than that ordinarly used, and at much easier Rates; That each Undertaker for sowing Lint-seed shall have one third Part of his Lint dressed by one of these Flax Dressers, and shall take a Certificate from him of the Quantity dressed, the Flax Dresser either

coming to the Undertaker's House, or setting up his Work within two Miles of his Farm at furthest.

XII. THAT upon Oath to be made by the Undertaker, or in Case of his Decease by his Executor, before any one Justice of Peace, or in Default of the Justice of Peace, before the next Magistrate, or failing of both, upon the Attestation of the Minister of the Parish, or in case the Parish shall be vacant, of the Minister of the next adjacent Parish; That the whole Conditions then prestible have been fulfiled, and particularly for the first Year, expressing the Quantity of the Foreign Seed, and from whom bought; and that the Acres mentioned in the Oath or Attestation were really for that Year sown with Lint-Seed or Hemp-Seed, which Oath or Attestation is to be transmitted to the Trustee's Secretary at Edinburgh yearly against the first Day of November, Payment of the Præmiums shall be forthwith ordered.

XIII. THAT if the Trustees shall discover by proper Evidence that any of the above Conditions, whether these to which the Oath or Attestation abovementioned may relate, or any other Conditions thereaster prestible, have not been performed, it shall be lawful for them to stop Payment of the Pramium, if it shall not have been already answered, or to retain the Pramium for the subsequent Year, without Prejudice to them, to prosecute the Offence further, as accords of the Law.

THAT the Person proposing to contract for teaching and setting up such a School, shall have a Certificate from the Kirk-Session where she is resiant, of her regular and good Behaviour, and shall have a Certificate from the Magistrates of the Burgh where she resides, or from Two or more Tustices of the Peace in the Country, or from some Two or more Persons of Note and Character in whose Neighbourhood she lives, of her Capacity and Skill in Spinning, and that such a School is necessary in that Part of the Country.
