THE following is the Result of an EXPERIMENT, made at His Majesty's Mint in the year 1798; by direction of The Lords of the Committee of Privy Council, appointed to take into consideration the State of the Coins of this Kingdom; upon Forty Pounds weight Troy, of the several species of Silver Monies, which were obtained at the Bank of England, and taken out promiscuously;—shewing the Deficiency thereof.
