GENERAL DE PAOLI.—A Pension of £. 1,000 per Annum was granted to him on His Majesty's Acceptance of the Crown of Corfica, to commence on the 20th of June 1794. That Pension was increased to £. 2,000 per Annum, on his quitting Corfica to reside in England. His Pension is held during the King's Pleasure, and is the same as he enjoyed many Years, during his former Residence in England.

£					£.	These Allowances are temporary and conditional. They commenced on the 20th of October 1796, when the Evacuation of Corfica took place. The List expresses the State of Allowances in January 1797, since which Period a Diminution may probably have taken place. A considerable Proportion of these Allowances, particularly of the higher Classes, is made to Persons having Families, and some of them numerous. They have been all forced to quit their Country, and have lost their Estates and Property.
