*Note.*—In the above Account the Duties imposed by the Act of the 1st Session of Parliament, Chap. 76 (commonly called the Convey Act) are not included, because some Part of those Duties were bonded, the Merchants being unable to ascertain the true Value of the Goods at the Time the Entries were made.  
The Payments into the Exchequer, from the Commencement of the said Act (viz. the 5th July) to the 10th of October last, on Account of these Duties amounted to £. 246,094 5 s. 5 d. but this Sum conveys no adequate Idea of the probable Produce of the Duty, because a great Proportion of the Sums collected at the Out Ports within the Quarter, had not reached the Exchequer on the 10th of October, as the Duties are remitted from thence by Bills payable 30 Days after Date.
