## SECOND REPORT.

THE COMMITTEE appointed to take into Confideration, what additional Orders, and what other Regulations, it may be proper to make, relative to the Proceedings of this House in consequence of the Union of GREAT BRITAIN and IRELAND; and to report the same, with their Opinion thereupon, from Time to Time, to the House:—

AVE made a further Progress in the Matters to them referred; and have come to the following Resolutions; viz.

Resolved,

THAT it is the Opinion of this Committee, That no Peer of Ireland, unless actually elected and serving for any County, City, or Borough of Great Britain, hath any Right to give his Vote in the Election of any Member to serve in Parliament for that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland.

Refolved,

THAT it is the Opinion of this Committee, That no Peer of Ireland, elected (or who shall be elected) to sit and vote on the Part of Ireland in the House of Lords of the Parliament of the United Kingdom, or who hath or shall have voted at such Election, hath any Right to give his Vote in the Election

of any Member to ferve in Parliament for that Part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain.

Resolved,

THAT it is the Opinion of this Committee, That it is a high Infringement of the Liberties and Privileges of the Commons, for any Lord of Parliament to concern himself in the Election, or for any Governor of any County in that Part of the United Kingdom called Ireland, to avail himself of any Authority derived from his Commission to influence the Election, of any Member to serve for the Commons in Parliament.
