The Reader is here presented, within the Compass of a few Pages, with a complete Analysis of the several Bank Annuities, deduced in a regular Series, from the First Year of their Creation, and stated in such a Manner, that the Capital of each Fund at the present, as well as at any former Period of Time during their Existence, may at One View be clearly and distinctly ascertained.

As the principal Merit of a Compilation of this Kind depends on its Accuracy and Perspicuity, great Attention has been bestowed on the Part of the Compiler to escape: the Imputation either of Obscurity or Inaccuracy.
