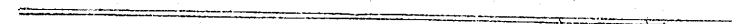

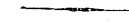

IN the Year 1697, certain Rates of Value were affixed to the several Articles Imported into and Exported from this Kingdom; and consonant to these Estimates, the Ledgers of the Inspector General's Office are still kept, and the Public Accounts are stated accordingly.

BY



BY the Act of the 38th of His Majesty, commonly called 'The Convey Act, the Merchants Exporters are required to declare the real Value of British Manufactures exported, in order that the Amount of the Duty chargeable thereon may be ascertained; but the Exports to Ireland, certain Articles used in the Fisheries, and Cotton Manufactures, of all Descriptions, being exempted from Payment of this Duty, and consequently from the Declaration of the Exporters, as to the Value, the Inspector General therefore cannot make an *Official Return* to that Part of the Order of the House, which requires the Difference between the OFFICIAL Value and the DECLARED Value.

But assuming, that Articles exported to Ireland, or used in the Fisheries, may be estimated at the same Rate of Value with Articles of a similar Nature exported to other Countries, and that an Estimate which has with great Pains been formed of the true Value of Cotton Manufactures exported, is correct; the Inspector General thinks himself justified in stating to Parliament, that THE VALUE OF BRITISH MANUFACTURES EXPORTED FROM GREAT BRITAIN TO ALL PARTS, AMOUNTED, IN THE YEAR 1799, TO £. 38,942,498, AND IN THE YEAR 1800, TO £. 39,471,203.

No Account can as yet be prepared of the Value of the Imports from India and China, for the Year ending the 5th. January last.

The Returns from many of the Ports in the Plantations being unrecieved, and others which are the Year 1800, is from that Cause unavoidably defective; but I conceive that the Defect is not that when the Returns from all the Ports in the British Empire are collected together and checked, the circumstance of Vessels being registered de novo at Ports to which they did not formerly belong, came to lay this Account before the House, as corrected with respect to that Year.
