The Generalities, Election Countries, are Paris, Soissons, Amiens, Chaalons, Orleans, Tours, Rouen, Caën, Alencon, Bourges, Moulins, Poitiers, Grenoble, Lyons, Riom, Limoges, Bourdeaux, Rochelle, Montauban, and Auch.

The Generalities, State Countries, are Burgundy, Languedoc, Brittany, Provence, Pau joined to Auch, and the Province of Artois, united to the Generalities of Amiens.

The Generalities, conquered Countries are Liste, Valenciennes, Mentz, Lorraine, Strasbourg, Bezancon

The Generalities, conquered Countries are Life, Valenciennes, Mentz, Lorraine, Strajbourg, Bezancon and Perpignan.

The Subfidies, free Gifts, and other Taxes of the Generality of Pau, are included in those of the Generality of Auch; and those of the Provience of Artois, in that of Amiens.

There has not this year been any extraordinary Receipts, Loans, &c.

Before the Re-union of the Dukedoms of Lorraine and Bar to the Crown, the ordinary Revenues of the King amounted from 200 to 205 Millions; since that Re-union they have amounted, one Year with another, to about 210 Millions.


