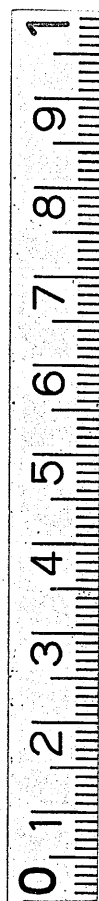

A CONCISE ACCOUNT

OF THE MECHANIC ARTS, MANUFACTURES, &c. BIRD-CAGE-MAKERS, and WIRE-WORKERS.

I Find it the general determination of all authors of repute, that those Arts ought to be deemed Mechanical, however vulgarly denominated, the Productions of which depend on the Use of any Machine: the very term, which we translate Mechanic, signifying in the original a Machine, or Instrument; and I thought it necessary to premise this, as I shall give the title of Mechanic Arts to some branches, which are most commonly deemed Handicrafts and Trades; and shall include in this part of my work the Manufactures, in their alphabetical order, as being so far Mechanic Arts, as they are all produced from some or other of the Mechanic Engines or Instruments, viz. Looms, Presses, &c.

The BIRD-CAGE-MAKER and WIRE-WORKER, the first in order upon our list, is a very ingenious Artift, the extent of whose utility is very little known; he not only makes Bird-cages, from various designs or patterns, some of which are very elegant and costly, but he also makes Corn, Gravel, and Lime Screens, Bras and Iron Sieves; and all sorts of curious Bras Wire-work

## BREWERS.

**T**HE Brewery is an ingenious art, and, in London especially, a most extensive article of commerce. The Brewers are generally divided into three branches; those who brew only Table, or what is commonly called Small Beer, which branch, though chiefly confined to home consumption, is very considerable: the Pale Brewers, who brew nothing but Pale Ale and

Amber: and the Butt Beer or Porter Brewers, which is the most considerable of the three, the consumption of this liquor being universal, not only in this metropolis, but throughout the three kingdoms; and the reputation of London Porter is risen to such a height, that great quantities are exported to foreign parts. ## CARPENTERS and BUILDERS.

**T**HE ancient and useful Mechanic Art of Carpentry contains simply no more than the method of cutting, planing, and joining of wood in various forms for the construction of Houses and Ships; but of late years the capital Masters of the two branches of House and Ship Carpentry, have assumed the name of Builders,

and Ship-builders; for this reason, because they make an estimate of the total expence of a House or a Ship, and contract for the execution of the whole for the amount of their estimate; so that they take upon themselves the providing of all materials, and employ their own Masons, Plumbers, Smiths, &c. whereas formerly it was the custom for gentlemen and merchants to apply to the several masters in each branch, and employ them in executing their plans: this indeed, is sometimes the case at present, but very rarely, particularly with regard to Houses, whole streets having lately been erected by Builders. ## C H E M I S T S.

CHEMISTRY is an art of so great antiquity as to have occasioned frequent disputes concerning its origin; some writers maintaining that it was discovered by the antediluvians, but all agreeing, that it was known and practised by the Egyptians in the time of Moses: the ancients however can lay no claim to any particular discoveries of general utility, arising from their imperfect knowlege of this noble art, which the great Sir Isaac Newton held in so high esteem as to style it "True Philosophy." Its present state of perfection has been wholly owing to the ingenuity and industry of the moderns, who, from their application of it to the discovery of the medicinal properties contained in Plants, Animals, and Minerals, extended their researches in Chemistry far beyond the confined limits of the ancient art, and thereby made such useful improvements in it, for the benefit of mankind, as have immortalized their works, and endeared their names to latest posterity. It is the opinion of the learned, that many amazing secrets still remain to be discovered in medicine by means of this curious art; and the powerful effects of some Chemical Preparations, already brought to light in this kingdom in particular, joined to the emolument arising to the inventors, ought to be sufficient

sufficient motives to induce the proficient in this art, to attempt further discoveries, which may prove equally beneficial to themselves and to the public. The number of those who pretend to be Chemists almost exceeds belief; but the following are really Artists, having all regular laboratories; and for the benefit of those who may be inclined hereafter to practise Chemistry, I have prefixed the name and address of the only public Professor I have procured any intelligence of, residing in London, viz.
