Committee appointed to consider of the Charge upon

HIS MAJESTY'S Civil List Revenue.

THE SELECT COMMITTEE appointed to confider of the Charge upon His MAJESTY's CIVIL LISTREVENUE; and to report the fame, together with their Opinion thereupon to the House; and who were instructed to confider of so much of an Act, made in the Twenty-second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as relates to the Establishment of an invariable Order in the Payment of Salaries, and other Charges on the Civil List; and of the Plan of the Establishments and Payments of the Civil List Revenues in Classes; HAVE proceeded accordingly to examine the Matters referred to them; and have agreed upon the following Report:

THE Charge upon the Civil Lift, for the Year ending the 5th of January last, has been laid before Parliament, by His Majesty's Command, in the present Session, and is inserted in the Appendix to this Report. But Your Committee apprehend, that, in order to form any just Conclusion as to the probable Refult in future, it will be necessary to bring together, under one Point of View, the Annual Charge during the Period which has elapsed since the Year 1786; at which Time the " Plan of the Civil List Establishments and Payments, drawn " out in Classes, and arranging by Estimate the Expence of " each Class, and of each individual Office in each Class," in the Manner directed by an Act of the Twenty-fecond Year of His present Majesty's Reign, was laid before this House in the Form at present subsisting. They have therefore extracted from the Report of the Committee on the Civil List Accounts, in the last Parliament, the Statements of Charge as then prepared, and have completed them up to the present. Time, by incorporating with them the Account of the last Year: they have rectified some Mistakes in Figures which were noticed in that Report; and have endeavoured to simplify the Arrangement of the multi-

farious Articles necessarily comprized under the authorized Title of Occasional Payments, by classing those for which no specific Estimate was formed in 1786, under some General Heads. It was necessary in the Report of last Year, in bringing the Charge of several Years together, to preserve the Items as stated in the Accounts submitted at different Periods to the Inspection of Parliament, in order that the Aggregate might appear to be composed of the proper Particulars. But as this introduced the Necessity of further Explanation in subsequent Tables, as well as led to unnecessary Minuteness in many Particulars of small Amount, Your Committee have thought it would tend to a more accurate Comparison of the different Charges in different Years, as well as to a further Understanding of the Whole, if the explanatory Tables above mentioned, particularly that of the Items comprehended under the Head of "Special Service and Royal Bounty" were blended in the General Account, and each Particular now referred to its proper Head, whether previously stated under it or not. They have accordingly new-modelled this Part of the Account; on which Arrangement it is only necessary further to observe, that from what has been above stated the General Title of Special Service and Royal Bounty will not now correspond with the Charge as stated in former Years, and particularized in the Book directed by the Act of 1782 to be kept under that Title; that, as the Occasional Payments in many Items are not, like the other Classes, subject to previous Estimate, and strictly of the Nature of Charge, so when the Accounts were laid before the last Parliament the Sum of £. 51,679 was stated as having been incurred, but not paid, previous to the 5th January 1802; and that this Sum is now incorporated with the Charge of that Year, under the proper Heads, distinguished however by a particular Mark of Reference, as tending unduly to swell the actual Charge of that Year, though necessary to be taken into the Average of the Whole.

Having thus explained the Mode of stating the Charge upon the Civil List in the Accounts contained in the Appendix, Your Committee have now to submit the Opinion which they have been led to form upon them. It is obvious, in the first Place, that, either adverting to the Charge of the last Year, or taking into the Account an Average of several preceding, the Charge has very considerably exceeded the Estimate formed in 1786, and consequently the Revenue of the Civil List Establishment to which that was adapted. The Mode of Classification adopted since that Period, points immediately to the Heads of Expenditure under which that Excess is to be traced; and these will be found to be so exclusively those of the Third and Fourth Class, and the Occasional Payments, as to render it necessary at present to advert solely to these, the Variation, whether of Increase or Decrease, in the other Classes being so comparatively minute, or so fully explained in the Report of last Year, as to call for no particular Observation here.

The First of these above referred to, comprizes the regular Establishment of the whole Diplomatic Body, the Charge of which, for the last Year, will be found to exceed the Estimate of 1786 by the Sum of £.19,045, 145. 2½ d.

It will appear, on Inspection of the comparative Statement of the Charge of this Class, that, during the Years of Peace, it has always in some Degree exceeded the Estimate; that the Increase has been progressive, being in the first Year above £.4,000, amounting in 1790 to near £.17,000, and in 1792, the Year immediately preceding the late War, to £.27,000.

This Increase is truly stated in the Report of last Year to have arisen "partly from some Addition to the Allowances of many of "the Ambassadors upon the usual Establishment, but principally from the occasional Appointments of Ministers Plenipotentiary, Envoys Extraordinary, Charges des Affaires, and Secretaries of Legation; for most of whom, as being only temporary, no Provision was professedly made in the Estimates of 1786;" and it was also observed, that "the rising Importance of America since that Year, had also considerably increased the Charge both in the Diplomatic and Consulate Parts of that Establishment, of which only the Appointment of Consul General was included in that Estimate."

In confequence of the late Peace, which occasioned the Reappointment of Ministers to France, Spain, and Holland, the Charge in the last Year has risen to the Amount stated; but, as feveral of the most considerable of these Items are taken only for broken Parts of the Year, and as it may be found necessary hereafter to revive the Diplomatic Relations of this Country, in fome Form or other, with feveral of those Powers with whom they have been discontinued, there seems no Reason to expect, that if the Rates of Allowance should continue nearly as in the Account of last Year, the Charge of this Class, on a permanent Peace Establishment, could be taken at a lower Scale, if so low as it actually reached previous to the late War, which, as above noticed, would exceed the Estimate by at least f. 27,000.

The next Class which attracts Attention, from the confiderable. Excess of Charge above the Estimate, is that which follows. comprizing in the Terms of its Title, "the Approved Bills of "His Majesty's Tradesmen, Artificers, and Labourers, for any "Articles supplied or Work done for His Majesty's Service," and, in Effect, the Charge of His Majesty's Household in the several. Departments of the Lord Chamberlain, Lord Steward, Master of the Horse, and Master of the Robes; and also several miscellaneous Articles of quite a different Nature, being, the Expence of printing Acts of Parliament, of providing Stationary for both Houses of Parliament, and that and other Necessaries for the Court of Exchequer, and printing Parliamentary Proceedings for the Use of the House of Peers.

Your Committee have preferved the Division between these General Heads of Charge adopted by the Committee of last. Year, and shall consider the Comparison of those Heads respectively with the Estimate of 1786.

Under the first Division, comprizing the Charge of the Departments in the Household only, the Excess of last Year, above the Estimate, appears to be no less than £.91,488. 14s. 2 4d. of which Your Committee will proceed to compare the particular Items:

Items; observing as to the Whole (as was stated in the Report of last Year) "that for the Six Years previous to the Commence-" ment of the late War, the Charge of His Majesty's Household " was, on an Average, confined within the Estimate, and that " in the highest of those Years it exceeded it only about £.7,800. " That in the subsequent Years a gradual but not regular In-" crease has taken place, which is particularly observable in the "Year ending the 5th January 1796, and in the Three (now " Four) last Years."

HIS MAJESTY'S CIVIL LIST REVENUE.

The first Item being that of the Lord Chamberlain's Department, appears to be that in which the largest Excess has taken place, having, on the Average of the Two last Years, amounted to just double the Estimate of 1786. The Bills paid in this Department are known to comprize not merely those immediately relating to the Office of the Lord Chamberlain, but, in consequence of the Reform which was adopted in His Majesty's Household, previous to the Year 1786, such as concern the Wardrobe, the Plate (late Jewel) Office, and the Office of Works; as the accustomed Presents of Plate to Ministers going on Foreign Embassies are provided by one of the Officers above mentioned, and as the Charge on that Account must have been increased in the last Year, in consequence of new Appointments after the Conclusion of Peace, the Excess of last Year over that of the preceding, may probably be in great Measure accounted for from that Circumstance.

The providing fuitable Apartments in the Royal Palaces for fome of the younger Princes of late Years, must also have added confiderably to the ordinary Charges of the Office of Works, for keeping those and the other Royal Palaces in a proper State of Repair, and have confequently fwelled the Amount of this General Head of Charge during that Period: With a View however to future Estimate, it may be proper to subjoin a Statement of the Average taken from different Numbers of Years, as far back as it may be thought necessary to recur. It will appear from the Account that the Charge of this Item was on the Average of the last

If it be considered, that the Charge in the Year previous to the late War, was only £.53,768. 16s. 2½d. which Sum it had never before exceeded; and that in Two of the subsequent Years of War, it fell even below that Amount, it may perhaps be thought, that sufficient Allowance will be made for the Advance of Price since that Period, if the probable suture Expence of this Department be estimated at the Rate of the last or lowest of the Averages above stated; and Your Committee have some Reason to believe, that those who are most conversant with the Subject concur in the Propriety of that Opinion.

In the Department of the Lord Steward, there appears to have been no Increase in the last Year to require particular Explanation; and by the Average taken in the same Manner as upon the last Article, it will be seen that the only Variation, during the same Period, has been between the Sum of £.83,000 and £.85,000, the Charge having been on the Average of the last

The lowest, however, of these Sums is so considerably above the Estimate of 1786, which amounted only to £. 50,000, and which it has exceeded ever since the Commencement of the late War, that,

that, confidering as before the Advance of Price upon all the Articles of which it is composed, there seems no Ground for supposing that it can now, upon a similar Consumption, be reduced much below the last and lowest of the Averages above stated.

Of the Two remaining Articles, that of the Master of the Robes has, on the Average of the whole Period, so little exceeded the Estimate as to require no particular Observation, (being only the Sum of f_{\bullet} . 277. 13s. 5d.) and to warrant the Expectation that it may not in suture exceed the Average of the sew last Years, there are for the last

On the Establishment of the Master of the Horse, a greater Difference is observable between the Charge and Estimate ever since the Commencement of the late War, but as the Advance of Price has been, during great Part of that Period, particularly felt in the Article of Provender, as well as in the Price of Horses and other Particulars, which in a great Degree is likely to continue, it does not appear probable that the same Establishment can be supported at an Expence much below the Average of the late Years, which appear to be, of the last

On the Whole of this Branch of the Class it appears, that, taking the Estimate on the several Averages of each as above stated,

the Amount would not be less than £. 182,300, which would be an Excess above the Estimate of £. 64,100.

The Second Subdivision of this Class comprizes Articles of a Nature quite distinct from the former, as has been already stated, principally for Printing and Stationary for the public Use, and that of the Houses of Parliament. On each of these Items there has been some Advance, but the only one of Magnitude enough to deserve particular Notice is that of Printing, &c. which includes that of Acts of Parliament, and Parliamentary Proceedings of all Kinds in the House of Peers, and which in the last Year confiderably exceeded any of the former, and amounted to the Sum of £.26,494, being an Excess of £.19,494 above the Estimate. The Circumstances which occasioned this Increase were noticed in the Report of last Year. During the Continuance of War, Acts of Parliament must necessarily be augmented in a great Proportion; fince the Union with Ireland they have increased still further, and the Measures adopted by Parliament for their Promulgation in both Parts of the United Kingdom, have been attended with fome additional Expence; and both these and Parliamentary Proceedings in general, must in all Times bear a Proportion to the Extension of public Business.

Your Committee have now to advert to the last Head, to which they proposed to direct the Attention of the House, that of Occasional Payments. The Amount of these in the last Year appears to have been £.247,192. 121. for which the Estimate of 1786 proposed only the Sum of £. 138,476. 4s. 6d. producing an Excess of £.108,716. 7s. 6d. The Particulars of which this Account is composed have been so recently under the View of Parliament, in confequence of the Report of last Year, and are now, as Your Committee trust, arranged in such a Manner to facilitate a Comparison of the Parts with each other, and the general Understanding of the Whole, that it appears at prefent only necessary to advert to such as have materially varied in the Account of the last Year. These will chiefly be found on the Side of Decrease in the Contingencies of the Foreign and Home Offices of the Secretaries of State, and in the Presents to Foreign Ministers, as in the other Heads.

of Allowances to Sheriffs, and Extra Extraordinaries to Foreign Ministers; the Diminution of Expence in the last Year is rather apparent than real, that of the former being increased (as above observed) by the Addition of what was due when the Accounts were laid before the House, and which might with equal Propriety have been confidered as applicable to the latter. On the Side of Increase, the principal Articles are those incident to the Renewal of Peace, and the Negociations connected with it, in the Charge of Foreign Messengers, the Equipages and other Allowances to Ministers employed Abroad, and some Addition to the Charge of the Police Office in Bow Street. It is only neceffary to observe further, in order to obviate any Mistake that might arise from the Arrangement which has been adopted in laying before Parliament, in the present Year, the Account of the Charge for Special Service and Royal Bounty, that, in order to form a due Comparison with similar Charges in former Years, Recourse must be had to the detailed Statement comprizing those Articles of Charge as prepared by Your Committee.

On a Confideration of the Refult of the Whole, Your Committee are of Opinion, that the Revenue applicable to the Charge of the Civil List Expenditure, is become inadequate to the various Services which, in the Estimate of 1786, it was calculated to meet. That, as this Deficiency may obviously be accounted for by the Advance of Price which has taken place fince that Period, on all Articles of Expenditure in which the Establishment of the Household is concerned, and in the other Branches of a more public Nature, by necessary Additions to various Articles of Charge, there appears no Ground to expect that the fame Establishment, intended to be provided for by the Estimate in 1786, can be supported in future without some considerable additional Provision; which Your Committee beg leave to suggest might be most conveniently made in the following Mode: They are of Opinion that it would be expedient, in the first Place, that a new Estimate, more adapted to present Circumstances, should now be prepared and laid before Parliament; that if this was properly formed on such Part of the Fourth Class as respects the Household, it might be reasonably expected that the future Charge

Charge would be provided for so as to prevent any Debt arising upon this Head.

They think it might be proper, however, that further Regulations should be adopted with respect to the Charges comprized in the Second Subdivision of that Class, as well as in the Third Class, and the Occasional Payments, which latter, from the contingent Nature of the various Particulars included in it, it is less easy to provide for by previous Estimate. As all these are, in most of the Articles, connected with the general Expenditure of the Country, though by His Majesty's Prerogative more immediately under His Controul, they are of Opinion that it might be expedient that they should be submitted Annually to the Inspection of Parliament, who would thus be enabled to observe whether any Excess above the corrected Estimate had taken place, to examine the Causes and provide the Remedy, either by controuling the Expence or taking Measures for its Discharge. Considering the extreme Uncertainty of many of these Charges, as well as the Necessity of discharging them by Ready Money Payments, so as not to interfere with the Order intended to be established as to the Payment of the other Classes, they wish further to submit to the Wisdom of the House, how far it might be prudent to provide Annually, by a previous Vote, fuch a Sum as might ensure their Services being provided for as they arise, subject to an Account of Particulars being laid before Parliament in each fucceeding Session, and liable to their Controul, as in other Cases of the Disposition of Public Money.
