#### A PROCLAMATION,

For Putting in Execution the Laws and Statutes of this Realm, for the Preventing the Exportation of Wooll, Wooll-Fells, Woollen-Yarn, Mortlings, Shorlings, Wooll-Flocks, Fullers-Earth, and Fulling-Clay.

Hereas many Good Laws
have been made to Prohibit and Prevent the Exportation of Wooll, Woollfells, Portlings or Shorlings, or any Parn made
of Wooll, or any Wooll-flocks, or any fullers-Earth, or fulling-Clap
what soeber, out of the Kingdoms of

Great Britain oz Ireland, oz out of the Jues of Jersey of Guernsey, with Sark and Alderney, into foicign Barts, out of the kingdoms or Illes aforesaid, un= der the several Penalties and Fozfeitures in the faid Laws contained; In and by which Laws several Encourage= ments are giben to such Person or Per= sons, who shall Due or Inform for the same ; And thereby several Directions are given, as well for Guards on the Coafts, as for Entring and Registring of Mooll near the Sea-Coasts, for the better Deeventing such Expoztation, under several Penalties therein mentioned; Pet nevertheless the Exportation thereof is still notoziously continued, to the great Discouragement and Pzejudice of the Woollen Trade and Manufakure of this Kingdom: We therefore, taking the same into Dur serious Consideration, and duly weighing the evil Consequences thereof to the Tioollen Manufacture of this Kingdom, by and with the Advice of Dur Priby Council, Habe thought fit to isue this Our Royal Proclamation; And We do hereby, in pursuance of the said Laws, Arialy Charge, Prohibit, and Command, That no manner of Wooll, Wooll-Fells, Moellen-Parn, Moetlings, Shoelings, Mooll=flocks, fullers=Earth, or fulling-Clay whatsoever, be at any time hereafter, by any Person of Persons whatfoever, either Natural-bozn Subjeffs, Denizens, og Strangers, Exported, Erantported, Sent, or Conveyed out of the Ringdoms or Places aforesaid, into any Parts beyond the Seas, contrary to the said Laws: And that all the Laws and Statutes (5)

Statutes now in force against the Erportation of the said Commodities, be in every Particular pundually observed and kept, upon Pain of the seberest Penalties. which by the Laws and Statutes of this Realm may be indicted upon the Offenders themselves, their Aiders, Procurers, Abetto2s, 02 Fabourers. And We do hereby Declare, That We will cause to be effektually put in Execution the Laws and Statutes aforelaid; And that all Afficiance and Encouragement shall be given by the Commissioners of Dur Customs, and other Dur Dicers. in the Recovery of the Rewards given by the faid Laws, to the Persons who shall discover and sue for the same. And We do hereby strictly charge and command all Dur Officers of the Customs, and others, who hall be any ways imployed or intrusted in the Discovering, Prose= cuting, or Dieventing the laid Offences, that they do use their utmost diligence in the discharge of their said Trust, under the pain of incurring Durhighelt displeasure. And the do hereby Arially charge and command all Our Officers and Mini= sters to be aiding and assisting to the Officers of Dur Customs, and others duly authorized to put in execution the said Laws, and all others ading in their aid. And for the further encouragement of all Wersons to be diligent to discover any of the Experters of Wooll, contrary to the said Laws. We do hereby Promise and Declare, That wholoever shall discover any Person of Persons, who, since the first day of July last past, hath or have exported, oz befoze the Kirst Day of July now next ensuing,

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ensuing, shall export any Mooll contrary to the said Laws, so as such Person or Persons be brought to Justice, shall have and receive, over and above all rewards already given by Ass of Parliament, the further reward of Forty Pounds, whereof Dur high Treasurer is hereby ordered to make payment. And if any such Offender shall make such discovery of any other of the said Offenders, so as he or they be brought to Justice, such Discoverer shall not only have Dur Gracious Pardon for his said Offence, but shall have and receive the Reward hereby promised, as asocesaid.

## CAROLI II. Regis.

An Act for Prohibiting the Exportation of Wooll, Woollfells, Fullers, earth, or any kind of Scouringearth.

OR the better preventing and avoiding of such losses and inconveniencies as have happened, and daily do and may happen to the Kingdom of England, and Dominion of Wales, and to the Kingdom of Ireland, by and through the fecret and febtil Exportation and Transportation, and by and through the feeret and subril carrying and conveying away of Wooll, Woollfells, Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullersearth, and Fulling clay, out of, and from the Kingdoms and Dominion aforefaid, and for the better fetting on work the poor People and Inhabitants of the Kingdoms and Dominion aforesaid; And to the intent that the full and best use and benefit of the principal native Commodities of the same Kindoms and Dominion may come, redound, and be unto and amongst the Subjects and Inha-

hitants of the same, and not unto or amongst the Subjects and Inhabitants of the Realm of Scotland, or of any Foreign Realms or States, as the same now of late in some great measure hath done, and is further likely to do, if some severer Punishment than heretofore be not speedily inflicted upon fuch Offenders as shall be actors or assistants in and to fuch Exportation and Transportation, and in and to such carrying and conveying away thereof, as a-

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forefaid: Be it enacted by the King's most excelson after lent Majesty, the Lords and Commons the 14 of in this present Parliament assembled, Fanuary, and by the Authority of the same, That export a- no Person or Persons whatsoever, from ny Sheep and after the fourteenth day of January, or Wooll, One thousand fix hundred and threescore, Woollfells shall directly or indirectly export, transport, carry, or convey, or cause or pro-Shorlings, cure to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed, out of or from the Wooll- Kingdom of England, or Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed, or out of or from the Isles of Fersey or earth, or Guernsey, with Sark and Alderney, being under the Government of Guernsey aforesaid, or out of or from any of them, or out of or from the Kingdom of Ireland aforesaid, into any parts or places out of the Kingdoms, Isles, or Dominion aforefaid, any Sheep or Wooll whatsoever, of the breed or growth of the Kingdoms of England or Ireland, or Isles, or Dominion aforesaid; or any Woollfells, Mortlings, or Shorlings, or any Yarn made of Wooll, or any Wooll flocks, or any Fullers-earth, or FulAnno 12 Caroli II. ling-clay whatsoever; nor shall directly or indirectly pack or load, or cause Nor carto be packed or loaded upon any Horse, ry, load, Car, or other Carriage, or load or lay on any Sheep, board, or cause to be loaden or laid on wooll, board in any Ship or other Vessel, in any &c. Place or Port within the Kingdoms of England or Ireland, or Town of Eerwick, or Isles, or Dominion aforesaid, any such Sheep, Wooll, Woollfells, Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, or Woollflocks, or any Fullers earth, or Fullingclay, to the Intent or Purpose to export, transport, carry, or convey the same, or to cause the same to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of the Kingdoms of England or Ireland, Town of Berwick. The Penalties.

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And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That all and every the Offender and Offenders, Offence and Offences aforefaid, shall be subject and liable to the respective Pains, Penalties, and Forfeitures hereafter following. that is to fay, the faid Sheep, Wooll, Woollfells, Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullersearth, and Fulling-clay, fo exported, transported, carried, conveyed, packed, or loaden contrary to the true Intent of this AI, shall be forfeited, and that every Offender and Offenders therein shall forfeit Twenty Shillings for every fuch Sheep, and Three Shillings for every pound weight of such Wooll, Woollfells, Mortlings, Shorlings. Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullers-earth, or Fulling clay; and also the Owners of the faid Ships or Vessels, knowing such Offence, shall forfeit all their Interest in the faid Ships or Vessels, with all their Apparel and Furniture to them and every of them belonging; and that the Mafter and Mariners thereof, knowing fuch Offence, and wirtingly and willingly aiding and affifting thereunto, shall forieit all their Goods and Chattels, and have Imprisonment for the space of Three Months without Bail or Mainprize; the one Moiety of which faid Penalties and Forfeitures shall be to the King's Majesty, His Heirs, and Successors, and the other Moiety to him that will fue for the same by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, or Information in any of His Maj fly's Courts of Record, or before

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the Justices of Assize, or in the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace: In which fuit no Essoign, Protection, or Wager of

Law shall be allowed.

And be it further enacted, That if a-The pehy Merchant, or other Person or Persons nalty upshall, after the said Fourteenth Day of Ja. on any muary, transport or cause to be transport. Merchant ed any Sheep, Wooll, Woollfells, Mort transport lings, Shorlings, Woollen-yarn, Wooll-Wools, flocks, Fullers earth, or Fulling-clay, &c. contrary to the true Intent of this Act, and be thereof lawfully convicted, that then he shall be disabled to require any Debt or Account of any Factor or others, for or concerning any Debt or Estate properly belonging to such Offender: Provided always, and it is never Proviso. theless declared, That this Act, or any thing therein contained, shall not be construed to take away any greater Pains or Penalties inflicted, or to be inflicted for any the Offences aforefaid, by virtue of any former Act of Parliament now in force.

And be it also further enacted by the Offences Authority aforesaid, That every Offence against that shall be done or committed contrary this Act to this Act, shall and may be enquired where to of, and heard, examined, tried, and determined in the County where fuch Sheep, Wooll, Woollfells, Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullers earth, or Fulling clay respectively shall be so packed, loaden, or laid aboard, as aforefaid, contrary to this Act, or else in the County where such Offenders shall happen to be apprehended or arrested for such Offence, in such Manner and Form, and to such Effect to all

And furthermore be it enacted by the Forfeiture Authority aforesaid, That all and every of the Ship, Vessel, Hulk, Barge, or Boat, of the Ownwhat kind foever, whereof any Alien er be an born, or whereof any Natural born Sub-Alien, or jects not inhabiting within the Realm of not inha-England, shall be owner or part owner, biring in and wherein any Sheep, Wooll, Wooll-England. fells, Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullers-earth, or Fulling-clay, shall happen to be shipped, put, or laid aboard contrary to the true Meaning of this Act, shall be forfeited to the King's Majesty, His Heirs, and Successors.

Provided always, That this Act shall not extend to any Lamb Skins ready drest, and prepared, fit and useful for

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Ordnance or other Thing, in or concerning fuch Ship or Vessel, or only for the necessary Use of any the Persons in fuch Ship or Veffel paffing or being, and which shall not be fold or uttered in any foreign Parts out of the Kingdoms of England, England or Ireland, or Town of Berwick, Isles or Dominion aforesaid; nor to the exporting, transporting, carrying, or conveying of any Wether Sheep, or of the Wooll growing upon any fuch Wether Sheep, to be carried alive in any Ship or other Vessel, for and towards the only necessary Food or Diet of or for the Company or Fassengers, or other Persons therein, and for and towards none other Purpole.

Provided always, and be it further enacted, That this Act, or any Thing therein contained, shall not extend to any fuch Wooll to be exported or tranfported out of or from the Port of Southampton only, unto the aforesaid ampton, Isles of Jersey and Guernsey, by or for the only Use or Behoof of any of the In-Guernsey. habitants of the said Isles of Jersey or Guernsey, or either of them, or to any fuch Wooll to be shipped or loaden aboard in any Ship or other Veffel, by or for the only Use or Behoof of any the Inhabitants of the said Isles of Fersey and Guernsey, or either of them, in the Port aforesaid, to be exported and transported into the faid Isles of Jersey or Guernsey, or either of them; so as fuch Person or Persons, that shall so ship or lay aboard fuch Wooll into any Ship or other Vessel, do, before the shipping or laying abourd fuch Wooll, deliver unto the Customer, Comptroller, Surveyor.

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Surveyor, or Searcher of the Port of Southampton aforesaid (out of which the same Wooll is to be exported) a writing under the Seal or Seals of the respective Governors of the same Isles of Guernsey or Jersey, unto which the said Wooll is to be transported, or of his or their Deputy or Deputies respectively. the which writing shall purport and express. That the party named in such writing is authorized and appointed to export or cause to be exported out of the Port aforefaid, so much Wooll, expresfing the number of the Tods, to the same Isle, to be used or manufactured in one of the same Isles, or in some of the Members or Parts of the same; and that fuch Party so authorized and appointed to export or cause to be exported that Wooll, hath before the making and fealing of that writing, entred into sufficient Bond to his Majesty's use for the landing of the faid Wooll in that Isle. And to the intent that the quantity of Wooll to be exported out of the Port of Southampton aforesaid into the said Isles, or either of them, in any one year, accounting the year to begin from the first day of January next ensuing, and so yearly from the first day of January, may not exceed the quantity here under specified, that is to say, unto the Isle of Fersey, Two thousand Tods and no more of unkembed Wooll, and unto Guernsey, One thousand Tods and no more of unkembed Wooll, and unto Alderney, Two hundred Tods and no Alderney, more of unkembed Wooll, and unto sark. Sark, One hundred Tods of unkembed

Wooll and no more, every Tod not ex-

ceeding Thirty two Pounds.

And be it enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the Governor of the faid Isle of Jersey, or his Deputy, for whom he will answer, shall not make to any Person or Persons, any writing or writings, fuch as is above specified, to authorize or appoint such Person or Persons, as aforesaid, to setch, export, or transport out of the Port of Southampton aforesaid, unto the said Isle of Hersey, in one year, accounting the year from the first day of January, One thoufand fix hundred and fixty aforesaid, any greater quantity of Wooll than Two thousand Tods in any one year; and the Governor of the said Isle of Guernsey, or his Deputy, for whom he will answer, shall not make to any Person or Persons, any writing or writings, fuch as is ahove specified, to authorize and appoint fuch Person or Persons, as aforesaid, to fetch, export, or transport out of the Port above specified, unto the faid Isles of Guernsey, with Alderney, and Sark, in any one year, accounting the year from the first day of January, any greater quantity of Wooll than One thousand Tods for Guernsey, Two hundred Tods for Alderney, and One hundred Tods for Sark, in any one year; and that the Customer of the Port of Southampton asoresaid shall keep a true account of all the faid quantity of Woolls, fo by him permitted to be loaden by virtue of this Act, and shall not permit any greater quantity of Woolls to be loaden than by this Act is prescribed, in any one year, to Anno 12 Caroli II: Regis.

either of the faid Islands respectively. under any pretence whatloever, upon the Penalty of the Forfeiture of his Place, and the Sum of One hundred Pounds in Money, to him or them that will sue for the same in any Court of Record. wherein no Essoign, Protection, or Wager of Law shall be allowed. And if any of the Governors aforefaid, or any of their, or either of their Deputy or Deputies of the faid Isles, or either of them. Mall give, grant, or make any Licence or Licences for exporting from Southampton aforesaid, into the said Isles respectively, of any greater Quantity of fuch Wooll, than is before by the true Meaning of this Act limited and appointed in that behalf; That then the respective Governor or Governors of fuch of the faid Illes shall forfeit and pay to the King's Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, the Sum of Twenty Pounds of lawful Money of England, for every Tod of Wooll which shall be so licenfed to be exported, over and above the Rate and Proportion of Wooll in and by this Act, or the true Meaning thereof, limited or appointed.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That the respective Governors aforesaid, or their respective Deputies, or any of their Clerks, Officers, or Servants, for the granting, making, or fealing of every fuch Writing of Licence as is aforesaid, and for the entring a Remembrance of the same into some Book, which they shall have and keep for that purpose. may have and take the Sum of Twelve Pence, and no more, upon pain of forfeiting to the Party grieved the Sum of Five Shillings for every Peny which shall be taken

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Twelve Pence in and by this Act allowed to be taken, and so after that proportion; the said Penalty or Forseiture for the taking above Twelve Pence, as asoresaid, to be recovered by Bill, Plaint, or Information, in any Court of Record at West-minster, or elsewhere, wherein no Injunction, Protection, Privilege, Essoign, or Wager of Law shall be admitted or allowed.

# CAROLI II. Regis.

An Act against the exporting of Sheep, Wooll, Woollfells, Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullers-earth, Fulling-clay, and Tobacco pipe-clay.

7 Hereas against the Laws of this Kingdom, great Numbers of Sheep, and great Quantities of Wooll, Woollfells, Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullers-earth, or Fulling-clay are fecretly exported, transported, carried, and conveyed out of the Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, the Town of Berwick upon Tweed, and Kingdom of Ireland, into the Kingdom of Scotland, and into foreign Parts, to the great Decay of the Woollen Manufactures, the Ruin of many Families, and the Destruction of the Navigation and Commerce of the Kingdoms, Town, and Dominion aforesaid, which is like daily to increase, if some further remedy be not provided, and further Penalties imposed upon the Offenders therein:

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Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the same, That if any Person or Persons shall from and after the First Day of August, One thousand six hundred Export- fixty and two, directly or indirctly, export, transport, carry, or convey, or shall carrying cause to be exported, transported, carried, of Sheep, or conveyed out of, or from the Kingdom Wooll, or conveyed out or, or from the Kingdom Woollfells of England, Dominion of Wales, or Mortlings, Town of Berwick upon Tweed, or after Shorlings, the First Day of January, One thousand fix hundred fixty and two, out of the Kingdom of Ireland, into any Parts or Fullers Places out of the Kingdoms, or Dominion earth. Ful. aforesaid, or into the Kingdom of Scotling-clay, land, any Sheep or Wooll what soever of out of the Breed or Growth of the Kingdoms, England, or Dominion aforesaid, or any Woollfells, Wales, or Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, or any Fullers-earth, or Fulling-clay whatsoever, or shall directly or indirectly pack or load, or cause to be packed or loaden, upon any Horse, Cart, or other Carriage, or shall load or lay on board, or cause to be loaden or laid on board, in any Ship or other Vessel, in any Place within the Kingdoms of England or Ireland, Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed aforefaid, any fuch Sheep, Wooll, Woollfells, Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullers-earth, or Fulling-clay, to the Intent or Purpose to export, transport, carry, or convey the fame, or to cause the same to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed

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out of the Kingdoms of England, or Ireland, the Dominion of Wales, or Town of Berwick upon Tweed aforesaid, into the Kingdom of Scotland, or into any foreign Parts, that then every fuch offence shall be adjudged Felony, and the Made Fe-Offender or Offenders, being duly convict lony. ed, shall suffer and sorfeit as in case of Fe-

lony.

And be it further enacted by the Au-Aiders thority aforesaid, That every Owner of and Asany fuch Ship or other Vessel, and every sisters Owner of every Horse, Cart, or Carriage, shall be upon which any Sheep, Wooll, Woollfells, adjudged Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Felons. Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullers-earth, or Fulling-clay, shall be so exported, transported, carried, or conveyed, as aforefaid, or to any fuch intent or purpose, as aforefaid, knowing thereof, and being wittingly and willingly aiding, affifting, or confenting thereunto, and also every Master and Mariner of or in such Ship or other Vessel, wherein any such Sheep, Wooll, Wooll-fells, Mortlings, Shorlings, Yarn made of Wooll, Wooll-flocks, Fullers-earth, or Fulling-clay, shall be so exported, transported, carried, or conveyed, or loaden or laid on Board, as aforesaid, to any such intent or purpose. as aforesaid, knowing thereof, and being wittingly or willingly aiding, affifting, or confenting thereunto, and also every Factor or Servant, or other Person whatfoever, and every Customer, Comptroller, Waiter, Searcher, Surveyor, or other Officer, or Person whatsoever, knowing thereof, and being wittingly or willingly aiding, affifting, or confenting thereunto, shall be, and shall be adjudged

and taken to be a Felon, and every Offender or Offenders therein being duly convicted, shall suffer and forfeit as in cale of Felony.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforesaid. An Act to restrain the Exportation of Leather and Raw Hides out of the Realm of England.

Hereas notwithstanding the many good Laws before this time made, and still in force, prohibiting the Exportation of Leather out of this Realm, and the Penalty by those Acts imposed, by the Cunning and Subtilty of some Persons, and the Neglect of others, who ought to take care thereof, there are such quantities of Leather daily exported to Foreign Parts, that the Price of Leather is grown to those excessive Rates, that many Artisicers working Leather, cannot surnish themselves with sufficient store thereof for the carrying on of their Trades; and the poor fort of people are not able to buy those things made of Leather, which of necessity they must make use of:

For redress of which Griefs, be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons, in this present Parlia-
